City council hears about sewer problems, garbage contract

There was some trash talkin' going on at Tuesday's Hoopeston City council meeting.

Ald. Lourdine Florek, chairman of the water/sewer committee, asked for help from residents in keeping Hoopeston's sanitary sewers flowing by limiting what is put down drains.

The sanitary system is being bogged down by large amounts of grease dumped down sinks and toilets. When the grease conceals in sewer lines, other items become trapped, causing problems.

The Prairie Meadows lift station had to be cleaned out recently because it was full of items that should not have been put down drains or flushed, Florek said, referring to "A Guide to What You can and Can't Flush and Put down the Drain," published by safehome.org.

"According to the guide, the only things that should be flushed are the Three Ps - pee, poop and paper," she said.

diapers, hair, tampon applicators, and flushable wipes. “Manufacturers say they’re flushable, but those on the sewer side say they’re not,” Florek said. She explained that, if agitated for several minutes, wipes will break down. However, in a sewer line, the wipes are not agitated and become tangled with other material, forming a mass that clogs the system.

She is asking residents to stop pouring grease and other items into the system and suggested using an empty can to hold grease. When the can is full, it may be placed in the garbage. Another solution would be to wipe grease out of pans with paper towel and dispose of the towels in the garbage.

“A Guide to What You Can and Can’t Flush and Put down the Drain” is available at city hall or online at www.safehome.org/resources/down-the-drain-guide/.

In other trash issues, a motion to approve a new contract with Republic Services for garbage pickup died for lack of a second after questions arose about bulk pickup.

The city’s current contract with Republic expired in March and has been renewed twice, said Ald. Bill Goodwine. The only company to bid, Republic will keep its rate of \$342,329 for two years of a proposed five-year contract if it can stop twice-weekly bulk pickup throughout the city. Instead, the company is suggested a large roll off container be centrally located in the city to which residents may take their own bulk items - those things that do not fit in the blue totes. If bulk pickup is kept, it will add \$76,356 to the annual cost.

Concerns about a roll off include people not using it and people dumping illegal items, such as TVs.

When no one seconded Goodwine’s motion to accept the contract, it was tabled until the May 21 meeting.
