Hoopeston, Rossville, Rankin celebrate independence this week

Area communities will celebrate Independence Day this week with flashes of color and family fun.

Hoopeston will get the party started on Wednesday with its annual fireworks display. Pyrotechnics will be set off at dusk from the soccer fields on South Sixth Ave.

Unlike many previous years, this year's display is truly a community effort.

For several years, Carle Hoopeston Regional Health Center has donated \$25,000 toward the \$40,000 display, with Hoopeston Retirement Village Foundation (HRVF) picking up the remaining cost.

Earlier this year, HRVF opted to use its funds for other purposes. Mayor Bill Crusinberry spearheaded a drive to raise the needed funds from industry, businesses, organizations and residents.

The request was successful and Hoopeston will again have a display that is "second only to the Freedom Celebration of Champaign," Crusinberry said.

Rossville's celebration will begin at 11 a.m. Thursday with the annual Fourth of July Parade. Entries will line up beginning at 10:30 a.m. behind the grade school.
