## Students messy, artistic in making prints without a press

Collagraphy is a print-making process introduced in 1955, in which materials are applied to an inked hard surface, then used to print on paper.

The printmaking process can be colorful and quite messy, but students who learned the print process in a recent College for Kids class at the DACC Higher Learning Center in Hoopeston had a secret staple that collagraphy developer Glen Alps never dreamed of. Baby wipes.

The moistened disposable cloths got a new use in instructor Carl Ankenbrand's class. The wipes were used for everything from cleaning ink off of fingers and faces to cleaning the Gelli plates used in the print-making pro-

To make a print, each student put acrylic paint - a single color or perhaps several - on a Gelli plate. Each artist chose whether to cover the entire plate in color or create a pattern with the paint, such as stripes or swirls. Students then laid objects on the plate, getting them "inked" before pressing them on paper to create a print.

The object to be inked could be anything: a shell or a piece of corrugated cardboard for texture or a piece of cardboard or Styrofoam cut in the shape of the artist's imagination.

Eight-year-old Olive Clayton's favorite project was a caterpillar in grass, while Ashton Zorns used USA and bring your own projects.
