First city bulk garbage collection goes off without a hitch

Several Hoopeston residents got rid of unwanted items at Saturday's bulk garbage collection at city hall.

"We unloaded 28 vehicles," said Ald. Bill Goodwine, who was onsite at the collection from before its 6 a.m. start until after it ended at noon.

Goodwine was joined by city employees Pete Neal and Don Stebbins helping unload and Trish Stebbins and Dawn Layden, who checked identifications and handled paperwork.

A driver from Republic Services also spent the morning at the site, in case the dumpster was filled and had to be replaced. Items were compacted in the dumpster to keep it from overflowing; a second was not needed.

When not working, Goodwine and the others often stayed in a tent set up to keep the sun off them during last weekend's excessive heat warning. The item most thrown away was mattresses. One person got rid of six, Goodwine said.

Goodwine had no complaints about the event, but did have praise for city employees. "Watching our employees not only work, but how they treated people in such a friendly, nice and professional manner, reminded me again what dedicated employees we have," he said.

"I think the economics are working out quite well," he added.

In a new contract between Republic Services and Hoopeston, bulk pickup - which had been provide as part of the previous contract - was going to add \$76,000 to the annual cost, which would have been passed on to residents as an additional \$3 per month on their garbage bills.

Goodwine, who is chairman of the city's finance committee, suggested a trial communal collection where residents could take bulk items for disposal. The idea was approved by the city council.

The first site - the soccer fields on South Sixth Ave. did not work well as it was used by non-city residents and banned items were put it the dumpster.

The council then decided to change the location to city hall and hold a collection the first and third Saturdays of each month.

"Some may not like having to deliver bulk trash to a central site rather than the convenience of having it picked up, but I like the fact that we are keeping our dollars local," Goodwine said. "We are paying Hoopeston employees rather than out-of-town truck drivers to provide an outlet for bulk garbage."

Based on Saturday's event, Goodwin said he will suggest to the council that the hours be cut from 6 a.m.noon to 8 a.m.-noon.

The next collection will be held August 3.
