## HA board sets August 1, 2020 as Honeywell demo deadline

The former Honeywell School building could be just a memory by this time next year, if Hoopeston Area School Board has its way.

The board set a target date of August 1, 2020 to have the building taken down and will backtrack from that date to make other decisions.

Among those decisions is how to dispose of things such as playground equipment; what to do with items of historical value in the building; how to dispose of parts of the building itself, including woodwork and metal railings; and what to do with the property once the school is gone.

The finance committee would like an advisory committee to be formed of school district and community representatives to decide how such things should be handled, said board member Lisa Leigh, finance committee member.

The suggestion drew mixed results from other board members. Lee Cox and Rich Eisenmann favoring moving ahead with demolition but Lawrence Jahn, finance committee chairman, said an advisory committee could be "a good benefit to the (finance) committee."

Business manager Mark Eighner said the finance committee "has a lot of ideas. We're just short on follow-through." An advisory committee - perhaps including someone who lives near Honeywell and could talk to neighbors - could be an asset in making decisions.

Some board members suggested that industrial arts students could harvest some of the building's materials, like the hardwood, which could be used for projects but the logistics of that are problematic.

"I'm not for using class time because it would be counterproductive," said high school Principal John Klaber. "By the time they got (to Honeywell) and got their hammers out, it would be time to come back," he said.

Wade Clemons, buildings and grounds supervisor, suggested students might volunteer to get the materials on a Saturday.

While Jahn favors taking the time to put together an

advisory committee, he also wants the project to move quickly to completion. "We're not going to put any heat in the building and without heat, the building is going to (deteriorate) pretty quickly," he said.

Clemons is anxious to get the building down as soon as possible, too. "Wade would like to put bids in the paper and have it down tomorrow," Eighner joked.

It was Clemons who came up with the August 1 date, saying Hoopeston Area will wait until winter to have asbestos removed because it's cheaper then. With that and other issues that need to be addressed, "August 1 of next year is about as soon as it's going to come down."

In June 2016, board members approved closing the school - which opened in 1927 - at the end of the 2016-17 year. In July 2018, the board heard from a consultant on the legal steps necessary to sell the property or dispose of it in other ways. Last March, the board voted unanimously to level the building.

In other action, the board voted 6-1, approving a new salary of \$72,800 for Emily Brown, district curriculum director. The increase was recommended by previous Supt. Suzette Hesser.

Board President Dave McFadden said the raise was supposed to be voted on in July but was inadvertently omitted from the agenda, which included a four percent increase for other administrators.

Prior to the vote, board member Lee Cox made a motion that the vote be tabled due to confusion about Brown's base salary. Financial data on the district website does seem to have contradicting information. The proposal for salary increases lists the base salary plus retirement for administrators. Curriculum director is listed with a base of \$64,251.71 for 2019-20. On the district list of salary and benefits, the base is listed as \$48,433, with retirement of \$4,790.07, for a total of \$53,223.07.

Cox' motion died for lack of a second.

A motion to approve the raise, made by Leigh and se-

conded by Eisenmann was approved 5-1-1, with Cox voting no and Craig Lee abstaining. Yes votes were cast by Leigh, Eisenmann, Jahn, McFadden and Debbie Klaber.

In related business, the board unanimously approved the wall-to-wall collective bargaining agreement - covering noncertified employees - with Hoopeston Education Association, through the 2019-20 year. Union membership approved the contract the previous week, said Dylan Swank, HEA president.

In other business, the board:

- Approved a \$10,416 payment to MTSS Network (formerly Response to Intervention) for professional learning and coaching.
