As farmers look toward harvest, Vermilion County Farm Bureau is holding a program to provide them with timely information on commodity prices and elevator facility plans for this fall.

Two local elevator managers will participate in the Fall Ag Outlook meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 17. Charlie Smith, with ADM in Hoopeston, and Rich Thomas, with Premier Cooperative, will discuss plans for their locations during the harvest season.

State Rep. Bennett details new processes for FOID renewals

In response to constituent complaints about Firearms Owners Identification (FOID) card renewal issues, State Rep. Tom Bennet, (R-106) spoke with the Illinois State Police (ISP) about some improvements they are implementing to make the renewal process smoother. It is important to note that FOID cards will still be valid during the renewal process as long as the holder applied for the renewal before the expiration date on the current card. ISP representatives say they average about 25,000 FOID card applications each month. They have a hotline to assist applicants, but it is only staffed by five people.

ISP is now implementing an upgraded phone system, which will include an interactive, automated option for those who just need to compete an application without speaking to a customer service agent. It will also let applicants request a call-back without having to spend a long time on hold. It will be possible to use the automated system to renew a FOID card or a Concealed Carry License (if there is no address change) over the phone, including payment.

Meanwhile, ISP reminds prospective applicants there are four methods of finding help with FOID card or CCL questions. You can call (217) 782-7980 to speak to someone, visit <u>www.ispfsb.com</u> to find information about frequently asked questions, e-mail ISP at <u>ASK-FOID@illinois.gov</u> for customer service questions, or previous Friday, Curt Kimmel with Bates Commodities will provide a commodity market outlook. Hoopeston girls get first win

The Lady Corjerkers golf team took their first win of the season Monday, topping Milford and Cissna Park at Hubbard Trail.

Alyssa Yaden's 55 earned meet medalist honors on the par 36 course. She was followed by Payton Armstrong, 58; Madison Foster, 62; and Kylie Brown, 69, for a 244 total.

In boys' action Monday, Owen Johnson, with a 59, was the team medalist as the Cornjerkers competed against Milford, Schlarman and Cissna Park.

Gabe Huddleston, of Schlarman, was the meet medalist with 44.

Other Cornjerkers competing were Deegan Leslie, 60; Trent Betka, 66; Trevor Swartz, 67; and Brian Armstrong, 70, for a 252 total.

Both boys and girls have shown improvement in the season so far.

In a quad match on August 19 at Hubbard Trail, Hoopeston Area, with a 281, lagged behind winner Watseka's 185, Donovan, 241; and Cissna Park, 243.



Swartz was team medalist in the contest with a 66. On the girls' side, Yaden led scoring with 51.

Yaden was meet medalist when the Lady Cornjerkers faced Westville at Harrison Park on August 26. Her team members were unable to finish the match due to weather.

The boys lost to Westville that day. Johnson led scoring with 77, followed by Swartz with 78. Betka and Leslie each had 81.

The following day, several HA golfers scored personal bests, facing off against Rantoul and Fisher at Willow Park. Swartz was meet medalist with 60, followed by Leslie with 64, Betka, 67, and Johnson, 68.

Rantoul's Trey VanWinkle was meet medalist with 37. The team won the match with a 166.

The girls golfed but had no competition at the event. Yaden shot a 50 and was team medalist, followed by

Armstrong with a 57, Brown, 60 and Foster, 65.

On September 4, the teams traveled to Iron Horse at Tuscola, where they took on Tuscola, Meridian, Villa Grove and Maroa/Forsyth.

Maroa/Forsyth came in first with 172, followed by Tuscola 214, Meridian at 225 and Hoopeston Area 255.

Villa Grove's boys squad did not field four players to have a team score.

Leslie, Johnson and Swartz each shot a 61, while Betka had a 72.

Tuscola was the only girls' team with four players for a team score.

Armstrong led the Lady Cornjerkers with 59, followed by Yaden wit 60 and Brown with 62.

The boys are currently 0-8 for the season and the girls are at 1-3. Both teams are coached by Dylan Swank.
