# Board hears updates on Honeywell asbestos, Maple boiler

Work needed to be done before the former Honeywell School is demolished is moving forward following action taken by the Hoopeston Area school board Thursday evening.

The board unanimously approved a \$41,665 bid from Kinsale Contracting Group to abate asbestos in Honeywell. "There's even asbestos behind the chalkboards," said board member Lisa Leigh, chair of the board's building and grounds committee. Asbestos removal is to be done by November 15.

Water will be needed for the abatement process, said Supt. Robert Richardson said, adding once asbes-


An advisory group formed to recommend what to do with items of historical interest is working on suggestions which will be presented to the board.


