Council approves demolition bid for Market St. eyesore

The low bid to tear down the building at 202/204 N. Market drew some questions from aldermen at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

At \$6,970, Silver Brothers, of Hoopeston, was the winning bidder, significantly lower than three other bids received: \$10,000 from Meuser Construction and Excavating, Paxton; \$24,500 from ARD of Wellington; and \$24,950 from All Industrial Group, Springfield.

Mayor Bill Crusinberry, who attended Monday's bid opening, said he questioned the amount as well, but Deanna Silver, who attended the bid opening, said owner David Silver will do most of the work himself, saving the cost of additional labor.

Crusinberry said all bids were to include destruction of the building and hauling contents to the landfill. Dumping fees will be paid by the city.

Bricks from the building are expected to be buried onsite before the excavation is backfilled. The project will be finished off with one foot of fill dirt. The finished landscape must be less that one foot higher than surrounding properties, he said.

With the bid accepted, officials may now purchase the property from the county tax trustees for \$800.

Crusinberry said he has concerns about a gas line that runs down Seminary Ave. to the site and wants to make sure that is secure before work starts.
