School funding, sales tax a concern for Hoopeston Area officials

A trip to the annual school board convention last month has local officials concerned about the future of school funding.

First, Illinois raised the base pay for teachers to \$40,000 annually. Second, state officials are considering a plan for the state to contribute more to education, along with a property tax freeze.

At Thursday's district board meeting, member Rich Eisenmann, chairman of the board's finance committee, said people in a convention session he went to are concerned that there will not be enough money to go around.

Eisenman said the freeze would be on the rate, so districts with significant economic growth would get more money through higher equalized assessed valuations. "We're not in that kind of area," he said, citing a proposed hotel and new gas station as examples of local economic growth.

"They give us a dollar and we spend a dollar," Eisenmann said of the state. "They're not going to give us any more than that and we need to put out more than that.

In his remarks, Supt. Robert Richardson corrected Ei-

senmann, saying the district gets a dollar and can't spend more than that but, "the state of Illinois has been doing that for many, many years."

Richardson is concerned about the state changing the funding model from property taxes to the state. "That scares me, absolutely scares me to death," he said. While not saying property taxes are the best way to fund education, "until they come up with something better, a bird in the hand is my pick every time," he added. "We're at the mercy of those clowns in Springfield."

Richardson wondered whether Gov. JB Pritzker gave thought to the effect raising teacher base pay to \$40,000 would affect district, who will pay more from the start to the end of a teacher's tenure.

Raising the minimum wage to \$15 per hour and education-based funding are also bad for the district. "A government big enough to give you everything you want is big enough to take away everything you have," he said.

The board also discussed the one percent school facilities sales tax referendum that will be on the March 17

ballot. Eisenmann called the sales tax "a make or break deal for the school," saying without it, "we're probably going to end up having to make cuts. We're going to have some very somber decisions to make."

If passed, the sales tax may be used for capital improvements, school resource officers and mental health professionals.

A wish list of district improvements includes air conditioning at John Greer and Maple, possibly a resource officer, as well as aesthetic improvements to some middle school halls, which some students say cause a "blah" feeling.

Richardson said the board must decide how it will use the money if the tax is implemented. According to information he's seen, it is suggested to have a big push for the referendum starting 30 days before the vote. "An informed public is what we want," he said.

In unrelated action, the board is taking a short break in its timeline to demolish Honeywell School, tabling action on approving Upchurch Group to design specifications for the Honeywell demolition.

Richardson said under the proposed agreement, the district would pay Upchurch 10 percent of the overall project cost to create specs and advertise for bids. If the board rejected the bid, the agreement called for the district to pay Upchurch 7.7 percent of the project cost, "and we still wouldn't have it torn down," he said.

After discussion, Richardson said he would contact Milford School District about how they handled demolition of its old high school.

grounds supervisor and Mason Layden as transportation and grounds supervisor.
