is also expected to

take a hit from the repercussions of the virus. Ald. Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman, said shuttering businesses will affect the city's income.

For example, online video gaming nets roughly \$5,000 per month for the city. A four-months shutdown would result in \$20,000 less revenue for Hoopeston.

Sales tax is another area where sales tax dollars are expected to be down both because people are shopping less but also because at least when it comes to eating, cooking at home generates fewer tax dollars. The sales tax at restaurants is 6.5 percent, while most food purchased at the grocery store is taxed at 1 percent.

30 to 32 percent, according to some estimates.

Another area of concern for Goodwine is the state's unemployment compensation sector. "That fund is running dry," he said. Because Illinois has no 'rainy day' reserves for unemployment, "We're going to run out really early in the game," he said.

Last April, he said, Illinois had 10,000 unemployment claims; this April, the number is 180,000. Goodwine said the state will probably raise rates, which could add an additional \$10,000 to the budget.

### **From the Blotter**

An orange Intruder bicycle was taken to the police station Tuesday after having been in the Hoopeston Area High School bike rack for two weeks. The owner may identify and claim it at the station.

**No tickets or injuries** were reported in a car/ bicycle accident at 5:11 p.m. Tuesday at Fifth St. and Penn.

Police said a 13-year-old girl in a bicycle disobeyed a stop sign, entered the intersection and was struck by a 2015 Ford, driven by a 16-year-old Hoopeston girl. "It's not very bright, the future," Goodwine said. "There are going to be some hard times."

Aldermen and department heads had prepared budgets in mid-March, before any financial impact from COVID-19 had been realized.

With the future unclear, on a motion from Goodwine, seconded by Florek, the council voted 6-0 to approve budgets as submitted, including accruals for major purchases, such as vehicles and major projects, but table one -time requests until the financial picture is clearer. Goodwine asked aldermen to hold the line on spending, as much as possible.

In unrelated business, "I dread spring," said Ald. Jeff Wise, "because of how many trees won't have leaves this year." As street/alley committee chairman, he was referring to the number of dead and dying trees in the city that

need to be taken down. During the fall and winter months, department employees have managed to make a dent in the number - sometimes up to five a week - "but with spring coming up, I just know that list is going to grow again," he said.

Street Supt. Wade Gocking suggested the city use leftover Motor Fuel Tax money on felling dying trees, while Goodwine suggested reserve funds might be used to take down the worst ones.

Wise announced alley cleanup will begin May 4 and asked residents not to help employees collecting the piles of yard waste. "With social distancing and all that going on, we just request that people let them do their jobs and everything will be good," he said.

Cleanup is for yard waste only. Piles with plastic, lumber, landscape materials, concrete or bricks will not be picked up. In other business, the council:

• Approved a \$9,000 bid from Treasured Roots for perpetual care decorations at Floral Hill Cemetery. The bid is \$500 more than last spring's bid.

• Approved an \$11,995 bid from Birkey's for a new mower for the cemetery.

• Approved \$800 bids from Julio Crispin for the police department's unwanted Trailblazer and Crown Victoria.

• Approved \$751.50 bid from Bill Redden for an unwanted cemetery dump truck

• Heard from Ald. Robin Lawson that three members have been added to Hoopeston Fire Department: Kyle Vaughn, Nick Grant and Brodee Herman.

• Heard from EMA Director Brad Hardcastle that there are no lab-confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Hoopeston but that there are a few cases of people exposed to the virus who are quarantined.
