Health administrator breaks down area coronavirus cases

Three new positive cases of people in their 20s brings Vermilion County up to 31 confirmed cases of COVID-19, as of Monday afternoon.

There is no strong connections found among the three people, said Doug Toole, Vermilion County Public Health Administrator.


Of the 31 confirmed cases, 20 are in home isolation, nine have been released from isolation and one remains hospitalized. One person died of the coronavirus last month.

Ages of those testing positive range from four from age ranges 0-19 years and 60-69; nine from 20-29; eight from 30-39, and two each from ranges 40-49, 50-59 and 70-79. There have been no positive cases of people 80 or older.

Women are leading in percentages, with 54.84 of confirmed cases, and men at 45.16%.

Of confirmed cases, 48.39 are white, 38.71 black and 12.9 Hispanic.

Health concerns, state opening plan cancel 2020 county fair

The 2020 Vermilion County Fair and Expo will not be held this year.

"After many discussions between board members and the local health department, we have had to make the heartbreaking decision to cancel our fair this year," said Rick White, fair and expo president.

The fair was scheduled for June 24-28, but the state's

plan to reopen would not allow the event to be held. "Our number one priority is keeping all of our fairgoers safe, and at this time, we just don't know how we could do that," he said.

The board hopes to reschedule the Queen Pageant at a later date. They are also working on providing some socially-distant entertainment this summer.
