## Commission members approved, grant may fix sewage issue

Seven Hoopeston residents were approved as members of the Hoopeston Preservation Commission at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

The seven - Brad Hardcastle, Marta Pierce, Jeanette Andre, Debbie Benjamin, Valarie Hinkle, Kristy Kelnhofer and Ellen Scharlach - were unanimously approved by the council and will oversee plans for the city's sesquicentennial next year.

The commission was established as part of an historical preservation ordinance adopted in 2008.

In other business, Ald. Lourdine Florek said she and Mayor Bill Crusinberry met last week with John McBride, owner of ERH Enterprises, about a grant opportunity to fix a problem at the sewage treatment plant. ERH has operated the plant for the city for

There will also be a DJ/entertainment, silent auction and vendors, as well as food trucks. A raffle for a television and \$500 cash is also scheduled.

Admission is \$5 per person for all activities and the run/walk.

She explained that a piece of equipment that uses discs turning on a shaft to aerate waste broke. The discs were fixed, but the shaft also needs work.

McBride recommended replacing the old system with a new one, which has a \$250,000 price tag. With installation and other costs, he estimated the project total will be \$400,000 to \$450,000.

McBride also suggested a USDA grant program that provides funds for projects considered emergencies.

Hoopeston will apply for the grant, hoping for full funding. If less than the full amount is offered, the council will have to decide whether to approve spending the additional amount or find another way to fix the problem, she said.

In other business, the council:

- Heard from Ald. Carl Ankenbrand that Officer Joshua Douglass' probationary period ended September 30.
- Had no objections to a proposal from Bill Goodwine that will eliminate \$8,000 in the budget to paint city hall and instead spend about \$6,000 to replace two doors at the police station, pay employees to repaint light posts and a guard rail at city hall, and install lighting in outdoor alcoves around the building.
- Heard from Ald. Chad Yaden that perpetual care bids are being accepted. Specs are available at city hall; bids will be opened at 10 a.m. October 20.
- Heard from Brad Hardcastle that the annual Spoook-tacular will be held from 5:30-7 p.m. October 26. Due to COVID-19, businesses are asked to use individually-wrapped candy or personally hand out treats. Also, there will be no costume contest this year.
- Learned from Mayor Bill Crusinberry that the city will move ahead to install new, high-quality basketball goals at McFerren Park. The project was suggested by Silgan Containers, which offered to pay more than the cost of one of the goals.
- Heard from Ald. Bill McElhaney that Bank St. land-scaping is done.
