Council approves amended ordinance; letters sought for seats

In a 5-0 vote, Hoopeston City Council on Tuesday approved an amended general nuisance ordinance to cut down on weedy jungles in the city.

The amended law addresses issues of standing water and overgrown brush which can harbor insects, pests and vermin, as well as which block pedestrian travel on sidewalks or impair motorists' views on streets.

The ordinance was set for a vote last month but was tabled after Ald. Bill Goodwine asked for a definition of "alternative vegetation."

Ald. Carl Ankenbrand asked, "Who would enforce this?"

"I don't know," said Ald. Robin Lawson, who present-

ed the ordinance. "I would assume the same person who's enforcing them now."

Crusinberry said Chief Jim DeWitt has been citing ordinance violators, adding he plans to hire a licensed building inspector to determine dangerous building violations.

Goodwine approved the new draft, along with Ankenbrand, Lawson, Jeff Wise and Lourdine Florek. Ald. Bill McElhaney was absent and the seats formerly held by Alex Houmes and Chad Yaden are vacant.

Regarding those vacancies, Mayor Bill Crusinberry said he will accept letters of interest for Yaden's Ward I seat and that letters of interest are still being accepted for Alex Houmes' seat in Ward III. 
