Illinoisans vote down constitution change, progressive tax

Minutes before midnight Tuesday, proponents of Gov. J.B. Pritzker's so-called "Fair Tax" said no announcement would be made until every ballot was counted.

Shortly after 9 a.m. Wednesday, they gave up.

"We are encouraged by the Illinoisans who cast their ballots in support of the Fair Tax despite the onslaught of misinformation and lies from those who were desperate to defeat the amendment," said Ouentin Fulks, Vote Yes For Fairness chairman, in a statement issued at 11:36 p.m. "Until every ballot is counted, we will stand with the Illinoisans who cast a ballot by mail, early and in-person today to ensure their voices are heard."

At 9:03 a.m. Wednesday, in another statement, Fulks said, "We are undoubtedly disappointed with this result but are proud of the millions of Illinoisans who cast their ballots in support of tax fairness in this election."

Rather than blaming Illinois' financial woes on too much spending, Fulks pointed the finger at "a tax system that has protected millionaires and billionaires at the expense of our working families, a crisis that was only made worse by the Coronavirus pandemic. Now lawmakers must address a multi-billion dollar budget gap without the ability to ask the wealthy to pay their fair share. Fair Tax opponents must answer for whatever comes next."

Final figures were not available at press time, but with more than 90 percent of votes counted, the ballot initiative received 45 percent of the vote, short of the 60 percent needed. "No" votes made up 55 percent of the total



at that time.

Had the initiative passed, it would have changed Illinois' constitution, which includes a flat tax, implementing instead a progressive tax which proponents said would have higher tax rates for higher income brackets.

In the weeks leading up to Tuesday's election, Illinoisans were bombarded on television, text and email to vote in favor of the change. Pritzker spent an estimated \$60 million of his own money pushing the tax change.

Locally, voters in Danville and the county at large voted against the initiative.

That togetherness did not extend to the presidential race, where Danville voters chose the Democrat Biden/Harris ticket 5,077 to the Trump/Pence ticket, 4,683. Illinois, as a whole, is backing Biden.

Danville voters - and the state - also chose incumbent Sen. Dick Durbin (D), 5,079 to challenger Mark Curran, 4,288. In the county, Curran received 14,452 votes to Durbin's 6,285.

The U.S. Congressional seat currently held John Shimkus will remain in Republican hands, as Mary Miller defeated Democrat challenger Erika Weaver.

In county races, incumbent Jacqueline M. Lacy handily won another term as state's attorney, receiving 15,476 votes countywide, compared to 5,739 for Democrat challenger Sandra Lawlyes. In Danville voting, Lawlyes edged Lacy, 5,019 to 4,760.

In the contest for circuit clerk, Republican incumbent Melissa Quick took both Danville and the county, defeating Gwendolyn Meeks.
