Increased valuation could mean more money for HA district

An increase in assessed valuation could net more monev for Hoopeston Area School District.

The district board approved an \$183,055.12 tax levy at Thursday's meeting, based on an anticipated increase in property assessment in the district.

The levy is up less than five percent from last year, and did not necessitate a public hearing, Richardson said.

In 2019, the district levy rose 8.17 percent.

An increased levy does not mean higher property taxes for residents. Tax rates - not the levy - determine how much property owners are taxed.

Many tax rates are set by the state, while for others, the district can levy the amount needed.

In related business, the board heard from Russ Leigh, highlighting the district audit, which he said was clean but would need a few adjustments to things such as state changes in how student activity funds are reported.

District finances are "in great shape," Leigh said, adding Hoopeston area is 4.0 out of 4.0 for financial recognition by the state for financial stability. He reviewed the district's three main funds and their balances, including:

- The education fund, which began the year at \$6,997,080 and ended the fiscal year on June 30 with \$7,208,019. The fund pays for everything related to student learning, including books and other resources. and teacher salaries.
- The building and maintenance fund had a beginning balance of \$63,733 and ended the fiscal year at \$321,736.
- The transportation fund began the year with \$87,573 and ended with \$207,292. "That's the first time in a long time it has grown that much," Leigh said.

The transportation fund relies on payments from the state, which are sometimes late or left unpaid.

Hoopeston's solid financial footing is good because districts "don't know what's coming down the pike yet," after Gov. J.B. Pritzker's "Fair Tax" was not passed by voters. In remarks after the vote failed, Pritzker said money to education would be cut.

Leigh said transportation funding would most likely be

cut, "but you've got options," he told the board.

Pensions continue to be a problem in the state, one that Leigh said legislators have discussed shifting to local districts. He said he recently spoke with Rep. Tom Bennett, who told him shifting pension costs "is on the agenda again."

Hoopeston Area will be able to weather the change, should it occur, but many smaller districts will not, he

In all, Hoopeston Area started last fiscal year with \$10.554.727 and ended with \$11.058.889. Leigh said the district has "above what the state would like to see," enough cash to operate for six months.

Related to possible cuts, Richardson said the Illinois Associations of School Administrators' Governmental Relations and Advocacy Committee reported Pritzker asked how much would be saved by cutting five percent this year and 10 percent next year from school funding. The answer was \$440 million and \$845 million, respectively, he said, adding such changes would require legislative action.

In unrelated business, the board:

- Approved memoranda of understanding regarding:
- Families First Coronavirus Response Act 10-day leave. Staff who can fulfill their responsibilities from home will not be charged sick days.
- Special education teachers getting additional pay to write students' individual education plans for teachers who are teaching special ed classes due to the teacher shortage but are not certified in special ed.
- Stipends for coaches and sponsors who are unable to perform those functions due to Covid restrictions. If a sport or activity is canceled, the coach or sponsor may develop a plan of program improvement to earn their stipend.
- Heard from Dylan Swank, Hoopeston Education Association president, that the union will spend about \$3,000 on gift cards from Hoopeston-owned and Hoopeston-
