

State revamps computer system, online vaccine appointment scheduling put on hold

Vermilion County residents who hoped to make an appointment online for a Covid-19 vaccine will have to wait.

Public Health Administrator Doug Toole said Vermilion County Health Department learned Friday the day Toole expected to the online appointment system to go live - that state would not have it ready.

Earlier last week, Toole asked residents not to call the health department to schedule vaccine appointments and instead wait for the online scheduler.

In light of the problems experienced by the state, Toole is now asking residents to call to be placed on a waiting list.

Currently, vaccines are available for Group A1, which includes frontline healthcare workers and others and, starting Monday, Group B1, including people 65 or older, frontline essential workers such as corrections officers, postal workers and those in manufacturing, food/ agriculture, grocery store, public transit, education and shelters/adult daycare. Toole said last week that there are roughly 32,000 county residents in the B1 category.

Toole had hoped the online system would make scheduling appointments less frustrating for residents and VCHD staff. "Up until now, we have filled our appointment books for the clinics 'old school,' with people calling or coming to reception if they wanted a vaccine, and then filling out their information on a paper form that



must then be entered into a state database by us after the clinic, he said. " It is an inefficient, frustrating way to handle mass-vaccination events, and it leaves most of the public and all of the staff unhappy."

Toole hoped that with online appointment scheduling in place, VCHD staff could focus on planning and operating vaccine clinics and plan for those who don't have or don't want to use computers to schedule appointments.

On Thursday night, Toole was notified that the state was revamping the computer system and on Friday, the launch was scrubbed.

Scheduled vaccination clinics will be held as scheduled despite the problem. Clinics at the health department include:

January 28 - first dose vaccinations for educators

February 2-4 - second dose vaccinations for those who received first doses January 5-7 and first doses to educators.

Three clinics are to be held at the Fischer Theater on February 11, 18, and 25 and will focus on second dose vaccinations to those who received their first doses in January and first-dose vaccinations to senior citizens.

Due to the trouble with the online registration system, VCHD will run "old school," with residents calling to schedule appointments and filling out their consent and pre-screening forms on paper.

Health department staff will enter the data into the ICARE database afterwards.

What will happen going forward is not yet known. Toole hopes the online system will be available soon but is ready to deal with whatever is needed. "We are in the initial weeks of what will be a months-long mass vaccination process," he said. "Things change suddenly, and then we adapt and modify our plans."

To be put on the wait list to receive Covid-19 vaccinations, residents may call VCHD at (217) 431-2662, ext. 243.

Region 6 return to Phase 4 guidelines puts local sports in play

The return of Region 6 to Phase 4 of Gov. J.B. Pritzker's Covid-19 mitigation plan has athletes ready to go.

While all sports practices and contests were canceled in Tier 3, the region's move to Phase 4 will allow school athletics to resume.

What is allowed depends on the risk category of the sport, low to high, as determined by the state.

Higher risk sports include boys/girls basketball, football, and wrestling.

Sports with a moderate level of risk include boys and girls soccer and girls volleyball.

Lower level risk sports include golf, baseball, softball, track and field, cheerleading and bowling.

Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) guidelines, which are used by the Illinois High School Association (IHSA), determine the level of activity each risk level may have. In Phase 4, low risk sports may have nonconference contests, out-of-state contests, tournaments and state series.

Moderate risk outdoor sports may have nonconference contests, out-of-state contests, tournaments and state series. Indoor moderate sports remain at Tier 1 mitigations: contests allowed within conference and region.

Higher level sports allows contests within the conference and region.

Last year, IHSA devised a schedule for sports to resume in Illinois schools. As the number of Covid-19 cases increased and the state was moved to Tier 3 and sports canceled, the calendar could not be followed.

According to the IHSA website, the group's board is expected to meet January 27 to confirm a schedule for the remainder of the school year..

Snow routes are activated when snow reaches 1.5" or more and a snow emergency is declared. Streets on the snow route are:
