# Changes made to bulk garbage day practices amid dumping by landlords, businesses

Changes have been made to Hoopeston's bulk garbage day, limiting who is allowed to dispose of items and listing items that will not be permitted.

The issue was discussed at a city finance committee meeting last week, after city workers reported that landlords were cleaning out rental units and bring mattresses and other furniture to bulk garbage day. Contractors were also bring construction waste to the site.

Ald. Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman, said by allowing businesses to dump, taxpayers are subsidizing the businesses. Also, he said, after a couple of landlords or contractors dispose of their waste, there is no room left in the roll off containers for residents to dispose of their items.

Prior to bulk garbage day, contractors would load a truck with debris and take it to the landfill and landlords would put former tenants' leftover items at curbside and arrange for them to be picked up. "It's

part of the cost of doing business," Goodwine said.

Beginning this Saturday, everyone who wishes to dispose of items must present photo identification with a current street address. Residents are limited to one load per bulk day and must unload their own load or bring someone to help.

Dumping of electronics, appliances, paint, liquids, tires, batteries, yard waste, construction/demolition material or anything that fits in the provided blue totes will not be allowed.

Also, items from apartments with a dumpster will not be allowed, as those residents do not have garbage fees on their water bills. Businesses and contractors will not be permitted.

Republic Services, which provides local garbage collection, had picked up bulk items at curbside on twice weekly, at no extra charge to the city. When the previous contract expired, however, the city was facing an additional \$76,356 to the bill. At the time,

Goodwine said the amount would add \$3/month to each resident's garbage fee.

Along with approved the new contract in 2019, the council also amended its garbage/trash ordinance, allowing bulk items to remain at curbside for a maximum of three days. After that, items were considered abandoned and were to be picked up by the city and the resident/building owner charged \$100 or the actual cost, whichever is greater.

Bulk garbage day will be held from 7:30-10:30 a.m. Saturday at Hoopeston City Hall parking lot. The event is held the first and third Saturdays of each month, except on holiday weeks.
