Riverton officials, in the release, said the arctic cold front causing the extreme frigid temperatures across the entire Midwest and eastern portion of the country was also affecting Texas and Oklahoma with ice storms and potential wellhead freeze offs. This is causing unprecedented natural gas usage. As a result, pipeline companies declared an emergency and placed a restriction on the pipeline. This extremely high natural gas usage, along with pipeline restrictions, is having a direct impact on natural gas prices, which "have surged to record highs."

Unlike many other communities, which rely on companies such as Ameren to supply natural gas to residents.

Ameren is also recommending its customers conserve resources to save on their bills, as well.

What Rossville customers will have to pay for February natural gas will not be known until the end of the month, but, fearing sticker shock, leaders are asking residents to reduce gas usage during the next week to help offset the cost.

IMGA is holding frequent remote meetings with Rossville and other members of the nonprofit joint action agency providing natural gas services throughout the Midwest.

Bulk garbage day

Bulk garbage day will be held from 7:30-10:30 a.m. Saturday at Hoopeston City Hall parking lot. Beginning this Saturday, everyone who wishes to dispose of items must present photo identification with a current street address. Residents are limited to one load per bulk day and must unload their own load or bring someone to help.

• Avoid using large appliances such as dishwashers, washing machines, or dryers

• Reverse your ceiling fan to turn clockwise, producing an updraft that will move the warm air that collects near your ceiling down to the rest of the room

• If using alternative heat from a fireplace, wood stove, space heater, etc., use safeguards and ensure proper ventilation to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning

Over the next few days, Pritzker encourages all Illinoisans to check on their neighbors, especially elderly neighbors who may need assistance.

Statistics show 46 percent of individuals expect to rely on the people in their neighborhood for assistance within the first 72 hours after an emergency or disaster. If you are unable to get in touch with your neighbor, or if you are worried, please contact your local law enforcement for a welfare check.
