Streaming company may be sidelined after poor performance

Snafus in live-streaming Hoopeston Area sporting events are causing frustration for fans and district officials alike.

The problem was discussed at Thursday's Hoopeston Area Board of Education meeting.

The district announced earlier this month that indoor high school sporting events held in the middle school and John Greer gyms would be streamed live by NFHS Network. Pixellot automated sports cameras were installed in both gyms to stream the games. However, only John Greer cameras are capturing the action.

"For some reason, when there's a game in the middle school gym, they can't get that camera to work," said Supt. Robert Richardson. Fans logged in to the network, expecting to see student athletes in the middle school gym. Instead, they saw an empty John Greer gym. More recently, when middle school games were streamed, "it's not Pixellot, it's Tim (Walsh) running four cameras."

Working with NFHS Network to solve the problem has not been easy. "You can't call or email," Richardson said. "You have to text." Richardson said he was driving recently and did receive a call. "We had a game tonight that you guys messed up," he said he told the company representative; also telling him to make it work or the district would not pay for it.

"I think they put in too many too fast and didn't have the manpower to back it up," Richardson concluded.

A question was asked whether the streaming system was needed, since parents are able to attend home games to watch their athletes play, but the question was not answered.

In other business, Richardson said a preconstruction date had been scheduled with Reliable Mechanical of Champaign for installing air conditioning at Maple and John Greer. The meeting was canceled because of the weather. Spring break will be March 26-April 2, when company representatives can "have free reign" on planning the project, which is expected to be done during the summer. In related business, the board approved spending \$20,518.99 for Reliable to repair the Maple boiler. The company installed the new boiler in 2019.

The company has also been tasked with troubleshooting and fixing John Greer's boiler. After 'three weeks of flawless operation," the boiler was off Thursday morning, Richardson said.

This is not the first problem with that school's boiler, as in December, Richardson reported a leak was discovered during a Life Safety inspection. The inspector allowed time for the boiler to be welded, resulting in a favorable inspection.

Much like last year, this year's high school students will experience an abnormal school year, Principal John Klaber said in his report.

Once again, the annual musical is canceled, to be replaced by a variety show that can be videoed in socially distant segments, then put together and streamed. Other fine arts instructors are looking at new ways to showcase their students' abilities.

Students interested in show choir - instead of auditioning in person - will be asked to submit videos of themselves singing and dancing.

Officials are discussing the feasibility of hosting a prom. "Under current guidelines, it's just not possible to do," Klaber said. Despite that, in case restrictions are loosened, the school is keeping its contract with a DJ and have decorations that were not used last year, he added.

Homecoming week will be April 5-9 and will also look different than normal, but will have the usual dress-up days and decorated hallways, he said.

The high school will be updating its Hall of Fame program, which features posters of graduates who have gone on to have successful lives. Members of graduating classes from 2000 to 2020 are encouraged to email their information to the school.

• Heard from Richardson, who thanked Gibson Area, Carle Hoopeston and Vermilion County Health Department for their efforts in giving second Covid-19 vaccinations to teachers. "If you got a shot, raise your arm as high as you can," he quipped.

• Richardson also told the board that the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules voted to approve the Culturally Responsive Teaching and Leading Standards, which will change how and what students are taught. The change was also approved by the Illinois State Board of Education in December.

Asked by a board member about the recent snow day and remote learning day, Richardson said "lunch." The district provides lunches on remote learning days to students who request them, but not on snow days. Also, he said, the snow day was on a Tuesday after a Monday holiday when not all students had taken their Chromebooks home. Asked why students didn't take them home daily, Principal Suzi Root replied, "That's not appropriate for Maple."
Heard that high school students will return to fiveday, in-person learning in March.
