The death of a Hoopeston man found dead in a cell at the Vermilion County jail Sunday is under investi-

Joshua J. Edwards, 43, was found unresponsive in his cell by a correctional officer at the Public Safety Building. Officers unsuccessfully attempted resuscitation efforts. He was pronounced dead at 11:14 a.m., said Jane McFadden, Vermilion County Coroner, in a

press release issued Monday afternoon.

Mr. Edwards was taken to the Public Safety Building after he was charged with domestic battery in an incident at 3:12 a.m. Friday. He was held at the jail pending an arraignment hearing on the charge.

An autopsy was scheduled for Monday. McFadden's office and Illinois State Police are investigating Mr. Edwards' death.
