## Curriculum director resigns to tend to family businesses

Hoopeston Area School Board on Thursday approved a host of employees who will work during the summer, some teaching summer school, others doing building maintenance.

Curriculum Director Emily Brown will not be one of those people.

Brown submitted her resignation to the board, effective at the end of the school year.

A former preschool owner and teacher, Brown was named curriculum coordinator, a position she held until she was named curriculum director in 2018.

With the title change came more responsibility, as she became involved with everything from curriculum to technology. Since 2020, Brown has been instrumental in developing and fine-tuning Hoopeston Area's remote learning program, implemented last year as a response to Covid-19.

In a response to an email asking why she decided to resign, she wrote, "I have decided that it is best for my family and our businesses to step away from my career in education."

Brown, along with her husband, Bob, own 112 Wine and Coffee Shop, Bricks and Ivy Sports Collectibles, Built 2 Last Construction, and B2L Property Management for various rental properties, including the Princess Apartments in downtown Hoopeston.

In related personnel business, several teachers were approved for the summer intensive intervention program, designed particularly for students who fell behind during remote learning. Officials have previously said that more than 100 students qualify to participate.

Employed as of June 1 for the summer program will be Tonna Hofer, Jamie Miller, Alexa Morton, Brenda Mowrey, Jennifer Gaddis, Elizabeth Hart, Kristine Kellerhals,

Hanna Rattin, Jennifer Robinson, Brad Jones, Mary Schoonover and Alissa Young.

Aides hired for the program include Christie Pancake, Emily Carter, Angie Torres, Karen Eighner and Angie Simpson. Elizabeth Walder will serve as the program's social worker.

Schoonover will also serve as a middle school promotion program teacher, along with Richard Harback and Bonnie Sterrenberg.

Other personnel action included:  
 • Hiring Glenn Brewer as high school math summer school teacher; and, pending background checks, Nina Frye as Response to Intervention interventionist and Madeleine

Lilley, English teacher and color guard sponsor, effective August 16.

- Approving the transfer of Chelsea Ziegler from John Greer and middle school PE teacher to John Greer PE teacher.
- Transferring Susan Goble from high school personal aide to Maple personal aide, effective November 2, 2020.
- Renewing educational support personnel for the 2021-22 school year.

The board also approved a three-year retirement incentive plan for second grade teacher Brenda Weston. She will be taken off of the district salary schedule and will receive six percent increases in each of the next three years. "She will leave very large shoes to fill in this district," said Supt. Robert Richardson, adding it is sad to see her retire "but I'm happy for her. She's put in her time."

In other business, the board heard from high school Principal John Klaber that the school is holding some normal activities by using creative thinking to meet
