Council discusses condition, remedies for downtown blight

A newcomer to Hoopeston City Council is tackling the issue of dilapidated downtown buildings in quick fashion.

At Tuesday's meeting, newly elected Ald. Kellie Ferrell presented information and pictures of the former Countryside Mall, Moose lodge and Bzzz Bar, suggesting the council use the recently passed International Property Management Code and other rules to take possession of the buildings and demolish them.

Ferrell, head of the city's civic improvement committee, expected no action Tuesday, instead wanted the council to discuss the problem and solutions.

Aside from using existing regulations, she brought two new suggestions to the group: a possible vacant building registry, similar to one used in Chicago, and a new ordinance that would ban residential use in the first floor of downtown buildings.

Chicago's registry states that if a building is vacant for more than 30 days, the owner must secure it to prevent unlawful entry; insure it with minimum coverages of \$300,000 and \$1 million for residential and commercial properties, respectively; register it with the city's Department of Buildings and pay a registration fee: post a visible sign with the owner's name and contact information and vacant building registration number; and maintain the property, visiting it to assure it is clean and secure.

The proposed ordinance to ban first floor residents,

pushed by Ald. Robin Lawson, would mandate operating commercial or retail business on the first floor.

In discussion, Ald, Lourdine Florek said she would not vote for the ordinance because it restricts the owner's use of the building and that ordinances should not be created to apply to a small group but should be something applied to everyone. Also, she said, the city has other means to monitor the situation, such as regulations that mandate residences must have running water among other laws.

Currently, most dilapidated buildings downtown have no running water.

Ald. Jeff Wise suggested adding non-profit organizations to commercial and retail businesses.

Ald. Joe Garrett suggested owners be cited and taken to state court, instead of Hoopeston City Court, where a iudge can grant ownership to the city for demolition/ remediation.

After hashing out what steps are available, the council turned how to finance the work. Mayor Bill Crusinberry was asked if tax increment financing (TIF) funds could be used. He said he didn't think they could, and asked former alderman Bill Goodwine, who served as finance chair. Goodwine said he wasn't sure but he thought they could. Florek then said she believed TIF funds could be used because the fund is to help remediate blighted prop-

erties to provide economic growth.

Crusinberry said the TIF fund has about \$400,000. In unrelated business, the council:

- Heard from Florek that the pool will open June 5 but the splash pad will not be open until repairs to the system are made. She reported that 58 season passes were sold Saturday, where everyone got 10 percent off the total cost of their passes. Passes purchased ranged from one person to a family of eight, she said. The day netted more than \$8,000 for the pool.
- Approved painting a mural on the front wall of the pool building, to be done by David Webber, who said \$500 had been donated for mural and that he might donate the donation to purchase volleyball nets for the pool.
- Approved, 4-3-1, giving Save the Lorraine Foundation \$50,000 in TIF money to put a new roof on the Lorraine Theatre. Aldermen Stephen Eyrich, Wise and Florek voted against, with Ferrell, Garrett, Lawson and Bob Porth voting yes. Ald. Kyle Richards abstained. His father, Jim Richards, is president of the foundation board.
