# Land bank to seek funds for pilot housing rehab program

If someone wants to get grand money for home rehabilitation program, but has no experience, and the programs want to give money to organizations with proven track records, what is one to do?

For Mike Davis, director of Central Illinois Land Bank (CILB), the answer is simple: get startup money, create a program and establish a track record, while still applying for state funds.


Davis spoke at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, telling the group that he plans to ask Vermilion and Champaign counties to kick in \$500,000 of stimulus money to fund a rehabilitation program that would focus on updating siding, roofs and porches for low- to moderate-

bilitation grant program, applications for which are due August 2. The maximum grant is \$550,000.

To apply, Davis needs names of qualifying homeowners, pictures of their homes and financial information and is asking for help from the council to identify people in their wards who could benefit from the program. "We're going to need a whole bunch of help in the month of July," he said.

Ald. Lourdine Florek, who served as mayor pro tem in



Davis said information from weatherization databases from Champaign Regional Planning and Vermilion County Community Action Agency can be used to find candidates.

He also plans to revamp marketing materials used by Coles County for its county rehab program.

Once the land bank gets its foot in the home rehabilitation door, "There's a boatload of money we can go after," Davis said.

Presenting information at this meeting, Davis will be back July 6 to make a formal request and ask for official council approval.

In related business, Davis updated the council on demolition efforts on properties in the city. Currently, CILB has taken on three locations, including 305 S. Second Ave., 406 Front St., and one at the corner of Wyman and Eighth St. Asbestos testing was done and demolition should be completed by the end of August.

The land bank legal team is filing abandonment paperwork on two other properties: 210 E. Washington, a

house owned by the late Brian Suiter, and 520 E. Honeywell, the former Dyer mansion, owned by Erik and Tina Pelikant. Despite repeated efforts, neither Mr. Suiter's heirs nor the Pelikants have been willing to sign over ownership of their properties.

Davis has previously said that, if all goes well, both could be demolished by the end of the year.

In unrelated business, the council:

Heard from Ald. Stephen Eyrich that Sarah Miller submitted the winning bid of \$5,555 for the 1970s-era tractor/backhoe. "She can pay for it and pick it up," he said.
Eyrich also reported that cemetery workers are struggling to keep up with mowing, with only two of four mowers functional. New mowers were selected, but will not be available for several weeks. Other options are under consideration, he said.

• Heard from Florek that the pool water heater was replaced, but that a pipe burst on the new one and it leaked over the weekend. The chlorinator, programmed to feed chlorine into the pool, has also been fixed. She reported that some aerators at the lagoons have been repaired and others are in the process now.
