### Police, finance committees meet to hash out spending Covid funds

Members of Hoopeston's police and finance committees, along with additional aldermen, met Monday to discuss suggested ways to spend American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

Joe Garrett, police committee chairman, and Bob Porth, head of the finance committee, met with council members Robin Lawson and Lourdine Florek on police, and Jeff Wise on finance. Florek also serves on that committee.

Aldermen Stephen Eyrich and Kellie Ferrell attended, as did Fire Chief Joel Bird and Brad Hardcastle, Hoopeston Emergency Management Agency (HEMA) director, who compiled the spending plan.

The meeting was called after questions arose at the August 3 city council meeting about some of the planned expenditures.

Hoopeston is set to receive \$340,472.72 from ARPA this fiscal year. Hardcastle said.

Some expenses were uncontested, including \$85,000, to be used to balance the city budget, \$15,000 for Covid expenses from March 21 through the present, \$10,000 to purchase and install a repeater for Hoopeston Fire Department radios and \$4,500 to make up a shortfall in the city's fireworks fund this year.

Others came under more scrutiny, including new trucks for cemetery, street/alley and water departments, estimated at \$30,000 each, and a new truck and more funding for the new HEMA/auxiliary police building at McFerren Park, at an estimated \$35,000 and \$30,000, respectively.

Hardcastle explained that employees are currently driving trucks with floors that have rusted through and mechanical issues that require increasingly expensive repairs. By keeping the number of trucks at current levels, employees can drive to worksites separately, maintaining distances in a closed space and potentially limiting their exposure to a coworker who might have Covid, he added.

As for the HEMA truck, Hardcastle said that the group had used an old ambulance as a command center but that it no longer runs. Hardcastle is asking for a four-door truck, rather than a two-door, to accommodate agency volunteers, as well as supplies, including those to fight Covid.

Additionally, he said, the groups need a truck because currently, equipment that used to be stored in the ambulance is now in a trailer. Volunteers are concerned about the liability of using their personal vehicles to pull cityowned property.

As for the HEMA building, setbacks and Covid-related increased costs have almost doubled the price tag since Mayor Bill Crusinberry broke a tie to approve \$35,000 for the building last August.

HEMA/auxiliary police had planned to do much of the See FUNDS on other side

work but conflicting work schedules has made it difficult to get manpower together and others who volunteered have moved. Miscommunication between whether plumbing or framework should be first, then finding an affordable plumber added to the delay.

Since the framework is leaning, the consensus of officials Monday was that it should be dismantled, posts should be reset and new trusses purchased. Garrett said he would relay the request to the contractor.

Other planned purchases from ARPA funds include new radios for auxiliary police at \$20,000, \$13,000 for a van for animal control, which has already been purchased and \$5,000 for any new Covid-related expenses.

Hoopeston City Council is expected to vote on the expenditures at its August 17 meeting.

City officials have requested the federal flow-through money from the state but had not been received as of Monday, Hardcastle said.
