Hoopeston, watching empty buildings for signs of squatters and reporting stolen items so others can be on the lookout.

While Florek said the group may be useful because Hoopeston officers cannot be everywhere at once, she and Ald. Joe Garrett urged caution.

A Secretary of State police officer, Garrett cautioned that the group should not turn to vigilantism, while Florek said a "look but don't touch" effort is needed and encouraged volunteers to call police with their findings.

Garrett hopes one burned out building that has been an eyesore since March 2019. Receiving no dissent from the council, Garrett will contact city attorney Dave Wesner to move action on Bzzz Bar from city court to state court, seeking a demolition order, with work to be paid for by the insurance company or owner. He will update the council as the case progresses.

In other business, Ald. Jeff Wise, street/alley committee chair, said the city has spent the first \$20,000 budgeted for tree removal, ridding city parkways of 44 dead/ dangerous trees. That money was budgeted from Motor Fuel Tax funds. Additional \$20,000 increments are budgeted for tree removal in city parks and at Floral Hill Cemetery.

In total, \$80,000 was earmarked in this year's budget to remove trees.

Wise said tree removal runs from \$250 to \$1,000 per
