State gubernatorial hopeful stumps in Hoopeston Saturday

Darren Bailey, Republican candidate for Illinois governor, wants to bring some old fashioned ideas back to state government.

Bailey, one of a handful of candidates running to be the GOP candidate to face incumbent JB Pritzker next year, attended Saturday's Learn & Lead Academy Color Run/Walk at McFerren Park, where he laid out a platform based on faith, family and fiscal responsibility.

Taking on education, Bailey said students are being taught controversial subjects and parents' concerns are being ignored. Education reforms are necessary because youngsters are the future of Illinois. "If we lose our future, we lose everything," he said.

Bailey is no stranger to education. He and his wife, Cindy, founded a preschool through grade 12 Christian school in southern Illinois. He also served for 17 years on the North Clay Unit 25 school board, including 12 years as president.

Bailey told the crowd he was not happy to hear that the University of Illinois was named the second most liberal college in the country. The governor handpicks trustees for public universities, he continued. "Public higher education is being hijacked," he said, adding "People are waking up."

The solution to problems in our schools starts at the local level and citizens need to become involved. If parents want change, Bailey encouraged residents to start attending meetings. "One of the things that strikes fear in them most is people showing up," he said, telling residents to ask questions and hold elected officials accountable for their actions.

People also need to be willing to run for local offices: school boards, town councils, county boards. "Every position must be held by a freedom-loving Illinoisan," Bailey said.

He recounted that Benjamin Franklin, coming out of the Constitution Convention, was asked by a group citizens what form of government had been created. "A republic, if you can keep it," Franklin replied. "Now

we're at the 'if you can keep it.," Bailey said. "All it takes is participation."

If elected, Bailey said he would reopen schools and the economy. Currently representing the Illinois 55th senate district, Bailey has been a vocal opponent of Gov. JB Pritzker's handling of the Covid pandemic in Illinois and his list of executive orders.

Bailey plans to return to Vermilion County during his campaign, which will stretch at least until the primary in June 2022, and even longer if he gets the Republican nod.

Bailey is pro-life, pro Second Amendment. If elected, he will work to lower property and income taxes and will promote transparency and enact safeguards against government overreach. More information on his campaign, or a way to donate, is available at baileyforillinois.com.
