HA board unanimously votes against pay raises, takes a look at in-town transportation

Raises for Hoopeston Area district staff were tabled after the district board unanimously voted against a suggested increase.

At the October 21 meeting, the seven-member board voted against a proposal suggested by Supt. Robert Richardson for raises for administrative assistant Rosellen Cornelius; Tim Walsh, building and grounds supervisor; network technician Tim Hillard, Denise Bray, transportation director; business manager Mark Eighner and Chrissy Coffman, payroll clerk.

Richardson said his recommendation was patterned after what educational support personnel received, with Walsh, Hillard and Eighner receiving a three percent increase. For Cornelius, Bray and Coffman, Using the collective bargaining agreement, Richardson suggested a one-time bump for each, based on their years of service.

The district finance committee was scheduled to meet Thursday to discuss the raises, but not take action. "They will give me a direction to shoot for," Richardson said.

In unrelated action, the board discussed the possibility of purchasing vape sensors for high and middle school bathrooms.

The monitors were discussed by the board's buildings and transportation committee after officials received reports of students being excused from class to go to the bathroom. Students text each other to meet up in the bathroom. "You can end up with 25 kids," Richardson told the board.

If approved, vape monitors would send a silent alarm to the office so an adult could check on students.

A 2019 Illinois law makes it illegal for anyone under the age of 21 to use e-cigarettes or vapes.

In other discussion, the board:

- Learned replacing middle school bleachers could take two years to get. An estimate sought last year put the price tag for replacing both sides at \$175,000, expected to be higher now.
- Discussed in-town bus service, an idea that came out of the September strategic planning session. The board discussed a software program that would identify how many

students get on at each bus stop, at a cost of \$750 per month and also a routing system for \$2,500. In all, the setup, including hardware, is expected to cost \$12,000 per year.

- Board President Dave McFadden reminded the board that they "don't need to reinvent the wheel on this. We did this for years up until four years ago."
- Heard from principals Dan Walder and Suzi Root about lost instructional time due to absences and tardiness.

Walder, at John Greer, presented a graph to the board that lost hours due to absences, including close to four weeks when Covid was keeping students home. September attendance was the lowest "compared to forever," although at the time of the board meeting, October was looking higher."

While some absences can't be helped, other can. Walder said he hoped over time, parents could be convinced that a birthday isn't a reason to keep a child from school and that a celebration can be held in the evening.

Root, at Maple, said in October, 25.5 hours of instruction were lost due to tardiness. "Every minute counts," she added.

• At a special meeting before the regular meeting, the board approved banning Gilda Lina from school property for not more than one year. The action stems from a verbal altercation on October 12 in the middle school. Lina
