see downed limbs or trees after storms, they should report them to city hall so that city crews can remove them. "If nobody calls us, we don't know they're down," he said.

On the other hand, if a power line is in a tree, a resident's first call should be to Ameren. City workers are not allowed to touch trees that have live power lines in them. "The quickest way to get the tree out of there is for you to call Ameren," he said.

Wise also said that, by ordinance, city workers do not trim trees for residents, including those overhanging streets and sidewalks. If the city gets involved, the tree will be cut down, he added.

According to Section 12.32.030 of the city code, "Any tree or shrub which overhangs any sidewalk, street or other public place in the city in such a way as to impede or interfere with traffic or travel on such public place shall be trimmed by the owner of the abutting premises on which such tree or shrub grows so that the obstruction shall cease. Any limb of a tree which has become likely to fall on or across any public way or place shall be removed by the owner of the premises on which such tree or shrub grows or stands. "

In other business, the council accepted a bid from Jason Longfellow for grave blankets. The cost will be \$65 for each of the needed 39 blankets, for a total of \$2,535, said Ald. Stephen Eyrich, cemetery committee chairman.
