Covid closes John Greer for the second time, Hoopeston Area Middle School out for a week

John Greer students returned to classes Thursday after having a week off to hopefully stop the spread of Covid-19. The school is closed again this week, along with Hoopeston Area Middle School, as both have large numbers of Covid-19-positive cases.

Supt. Robert Richardson made the announcement on social media Saturday, saying each school will communicate with families regarding educational material pick up and other information for student learning during the shutdown. Families who need a hotspot for internet access are asked to call their child's school office.

Students from the schools who need meals during

the break were asked to complete the Lunch Service Request if Quarantined form on the district webpage and submit it by 8 p.m. Sunday. The family's address should be listed in the answer box of the food allergies question. Meals will be delivered Monday.

Maple and Hoopeston Area High School will be in session this week. Administrators will continue to monitor Covid cases and make decisions that keep students and staff safe. District staff were to further sanitize all school buildings over the weekend and continue to increase cleaning and sanitizing procedures.

Dan Walder, John Greer principal, said during the

last closure, the building was thoroughly sanitized by custodial staff and others. "At one point, I found paraprofessionals on their hands/knees scrubbing crevices in our STEM Lab with toothbrushes and small picks," he wrote on social media, "Yet, a day and half after students returned from being gone for seven days, we had numerous students and staff test positive for Covid."

Council approves slightly higher levy over last year's

Hoopeston City Council approved the 2022 levy in a 5-0 vote Tuesday evening.

The levy provides money for the city from residents' property taxes. Maximum percentages in some categories are set by law, while for others, like police pensions, officials can levy the actual amount needed.

For general corporate purposes, the levy went from \$69,375 last year, to \$69,875 this year. Fire protection fund purposes increased to \$42,000, up from \$41,625. Police pension remained steady at \$375,000.


Also staying the same is city audit fund purposes, at \$12,000, payroll withholding purposes at \$80,000 and ambulance service purposes at \$42,000.

Other categories in the levy include liability fund purposes (insurance) and \$86,000, up from 85,472; city park purposes, \$21,000, up from \$20,813; and Emergency Services and Disaster (ESDA), \$14,000, up from \$13,875.

Unemployment insurance fund purposes had a big increase, going from \$13,600 last year to \$26,100 this year. Workmen's compensation insurance purposes was increased from \$67,000 to \$67,500.

Aldermen Kyle Richards and Lourdine Florek were absent. Florek has been serving as mayor pro tem due to Mayor Bill Crusinberry's illness. In her absence, Ald. Jeff Wise facilitated the meeting.
