

On a recent Friday night, watching Bill and Jennifer Lind work the Pizza King dining room was like watching a dance. The much taller Bill raised pizzas high as he walked to the counter, while Jennifer twirled out of her husband's way as he went to take an order.

The husband and wife team are the new owners of Pizza King in Hoopeston. They took ownership of the business November 1, 2021 and were up and running on November 3.

Owning the restaurant is a dream come true for Bill, a trained chef. He moved from Indiana to Hoopeston several years ago to be the chef at Hubbard Trail Country Club. In September 2020, he was Hoopeston's representative to WCIA Channel 3's "Our Town Grill Master" competition. He came in second in the event, sponsored by Illinois Pork Producers. In the years in between, he has cooked for special events and family activities. When See PIZZA on other side

the couple learned Pizza King was for sale, they contacted Carl and Marlene Shipman, only to learn someone else also had their eyes on Pizza King.

Disappointed, the couple went on with their life, with Bill working as a shift supervisor at Silgan Containers and Jennifer working for Hiltz Portable Sanitation.

Communication from the Shipmans put them back in the game. "We got a text asking "Are you still interested," Bill said. They were.

Both went from one job each to two, keeping their current positions and adding restaurant duties to the mix. So far, it's working. "Some days, I'm ready to come in and I think, 'I'm so tired," Jennifer said. "Then I get here and I think, 'This is fun!""

When asked how he juggles Pizza King and being a swing shift supervisor, "It's been a struggle," he admitted, adding that getting familiar with the working of Pizza King makes juggling the jobs easier.

Both said they will keep their day jobs as earnings from the restaurant are put back into the business. They have already had to replace some equipment. Also, a couple of weeks after buying the Pizza King building, at 111 E. Main, incorporated as Smoke and Pizza Pies, LLC, the Linds purchased the adjacent 109 E. Main in hopes of expanding their dining area.

Bill said he would like to expand the kitchen area and move the order area towards the front of the Pizza King building. A few tables would remain for customers to wait for their food. An expanded dining area would be created in the new-to-them building. But all of that will take time and money, he said.

For now, the couple is focusing on expanding the Pizza King menu. Pizza King is not a franchise, Bill said. Owners of the 73 Pizza Kings - 72 in Indiana and one in Hoopeston - have to serve items specific to Pizza King using Pizza King ingredients. That includes items such as strombolis and the pepperoni used for pizzas.

Owners can create new delights for customers, which the Linds have already done, introducing The Wreck, a sandwich combining sausage, pepperoni, cheese, onions and jalapenos with a nacho cheese sauce, served on a Vienna loaf. A Wreck of a pizza has also been created.

Pizza King will be offering oven-baked French fries soon and the popular breadsticks have been shined up with a bit of garlic butter.

A grilling aficionado, Bill is adding Italian beef and pulled pork offerings to the menu, including a nacho pulled pork pizza, a straight up pulled pork pizza, and pulled pork nachos. They're also offering a homemade marina sauce. He started to talk about a new chicken dish when Jennifer made a face. "We just had new menus made," she said, and that isn't on it."

It may not be on the menu, but Pizza King will probably be serving it soon - if unofficial taste testers like it.

When Bill gets an idea, he creates it, then offers samples to customers. Sometimes, employees make suggestions, too. If the items get favorable reviews, they're in.

The Linds' son, Will, 17, started working at Pizza King under the Shipmans and now works for his parents. Their daughter, Kennedy, at 14, is too young to legally do many food service tasks but is expected to join the crew when she turns 15.

Although the family will be working together, Jennifer and Bill agreed early on that they need to take time away from Pizza King to spend time as a family. Tuesday evenings and Sundays are now reserved to spend time with

She also talks about the cards and flowers they received when they opened, including from the owners of other restaurants. "They've come in here to eat and we go to their places," she said.
