Willdon ownership goes from foundation to fitness group

The Lorraine Foundation has spearheaded multiple economic and restoration projects including the Little Lorraine, Old City Hall, Sewing Boutique (now "Stay Awhile"), 402 E Main clean-up (old gas station east of Lorraine), but the most impressive, second only to the Lorraine itself, has been the revitalization of the Willdon Building.

After being vacant for nearly 13 years, the Lorraine Foundation reopened its doors only six months after taking possession in January 2017. The foundation had a significant amount of help to make Willdon plans a reality but none more critical than the investment Sculpt Fitness provided as the building's anchor tenant. Without Sculpt's partnership, the project would not have been possible.

The foundation is happy to share that Sculpt Fitness is taking their investment to the next level by assuming ownership and responsibility for the building itself.

The Sculpt team, doing business as Willdon Development LLC, purchased the Willdon Building to expand their business and continue restoration efforts for future expansion on the upper floors.

Originally listed at \$79,000, the Willdon sold for \$50,000, said Alex Houmes, Lorraine Foundation president. The lower price was based on Sculpt's previous investment, as well as both groups' aligned vision for the building's future and being local owners.

When the Willdon was placed on the 2016 tax sale, foundation members feared an absentee owner might purchase the building and strip it of its interior. "We had the opportunity to secure another historical structure and felt it was something we had to do," Houmes said. "With Sculpt's help, our risk paid off an downtown has been bettered because of it."

In the intervening years since the foundation took on the Willdon, its board planned to consolidate their efforts to better focus on the Lorraine.

Private investment has brought exciting new devel-

opment and growth to downtown Hoopeston, he said. "Now is the perfect time for our organization to continue stepping back from these additional projects to better focus on our core mission of the Lorraine Theatre's restoration and entertainment."
