## Old-fashioned fun, food on tap as Wellington marks 150 years

WELLINGTON—The organizing committee for Wellington's sesquicentennial is looking to the past and the future during this weekend's 150th anniversary celebration.

Activities are scheduled for noon to 4 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Sunday at Barry Voyles Memorial Park.

Saturday's events include historic memorabilia in the park, an historic tractor display on Main St. by the railroad tracks, and a bounce house and kids' games. From 4-7 p.m., the Wellington-Greer Fire Department will have a fundraising fish fry at the fire station.

Sunday activities begin with a Community Church Service from 9-10 a.m., hosted by Wellington United Methodist Church and Prairie Green Church of Christ, followed by live music from 10-11 a.m. Historic memorabilia will be on display from 10 a.m.-2 p.m., with a cookout and ice cream social, featuring Andi Mae's ice cream, from 11 a.m.-1 p.m. The bounce house and kids' games will be available from noon-2 p.m. and a kiddie pedal tractor pull rounds out the schedule, starting at 1 p.m.

Chip Houmes started piquing interest in a sesquicentennial celebration in January, noting on the Wellington Lions Club Facebook page that this was the year the village turned 150 and posting pictures from the 1972 centennial celebration.

The Lions Club and churches have been the driving force behind sesquicentennial activities. Houmes and Dustin Wells, pastor of Prairie Green Church of Christ, have been front and center of planning and getting the word out.

Houmes was initially concerned that there would be

little interest in marking the town's 150th year, but felt "we couldn't let it go by without doing something." An organizational meeting drew 12 volunteers.

While the number may seem small, anyone who has tried to organize a group knows getting a dozen people to step up, especially in a town the size of Wellington, is significant.

Along with Lions Club members and representatives of the churches, village Trustee Jane Powell is representing Wellington Town Council as a volunteer. Others are representing a long line of family involvement in the town.

One of those is Beth Totheroh, who "jumped in with both feet," Houmes said. Totheroh used her organizational skills to keep things in order and took on the task of ordering t-shirts and insulated cups as souvenirs of the event.

To raise money for expenses, organizers wanted to find sponsors to be listed on the back of the shirts, but most of the town's businesses closed over the years. Family members of those former business owners came forward to purchase sponsorships for Barney Jeffers Garage, Lockhart Sales & Service, and Gillins Oil Co., which had been owned by Totheroh's dad, Gary. While not in Wellington, new sponsors were also found, including Paul's Towing and Layden Farms.

When the event is over and all the bills paid, funds from the souvenirs and other sources will be split between the Lions Club and Wellington-Greer Fire Department.

The group had originally looked at holding the event in July or August, but when they learned the Wellington-

Greer Fire Department was holding one of their fish fries in June, they decided to move the date up. “It’s another thing that draws people to town,” Houmes said.

No sesquicentennial would be complete without a logo, and Wellington’s is no exception. Houmes approached Kevin Root, Hoopeston Area High School graphic design teacher, about having his class come up with designs. Several were submitted and the one chosen pays homage to the former Wellington High School mascot, the Dukes.

It may seem that the sesquicentennial is all about the past, but that’s not true, at least not for Houmes.

In recent years, Wellington has lost residents, going from 242 to 207 between 2010 and 2020. The town

has had had some new residents move in, who, Houmes hopes, will meet and get involved with “people who have lived here forever,” instilling a sense of community going into the future.

Just recently, Houmes said, he was driving in Wellington past the house with a lot of town history. As he drove, he saw the new owner and stopped to chat. The men talked about the history of the house and Houmes brought up the sesquicentennial and invited the owner - who had not heard about the celebration - to bring his son to the park for the kids’ activities.

In fact, Houmes hopes residents new and old will come together this weekend, enjoy the goings-on and maybe make some new friends.

The party hasn’t even started and it’s already helping the Lions Club, Houmes said. Because of the group’s efforts, its membership has grown.

There are many unknowns about the celebration:

how many people will come, how many tractors will show up by noon Saturday to be displayed during the event, will the sunny weather forecast suddenly turn to rain. But for Houmes, it doesn’t matter. “We’re going to have a good time no matter how many show up,” he said.
