# House burn provides training for Hoopeston, Wellington-Greer, Bismarck departments

It's not every day a person sees firemen milling about, joking and taking sips of bottled water while thick smoke rolls from a house.

But that was the scene shortly after 8 a.m. Saturday as Hoopeston firemen, along with those from Wellington-Greer and Bismarck, converged on the 800 block of North Market for a training exercise.

As firemen enjoyed the cool, sunny morning, a filled and lit pot stove in the house began churning out smoke, which eventually oozed its way under doors and through gaps between the sidewalls and roof. Once the house - at 812 N. Market - was barely visible, it was game on for the firefighters.

The men - and Hoopeston's sole women firefighter - got real life training in entering a building, air pack use, searching for people and other fire skills. "This provides

invaluable training," said Joel Bird, Hoopeston fire chief. Because it was not an actual emergency, Bird and his seasoned firemen could spend time explaining to newer members of the department in what to expect and what to

Under watchful eyes, newer volunteers lined up along a hose and, one by one, began entering the smoky chamber. Some remembered to crouch down as they entered to get under the smoke for better visibility. Entering through the front door, the line made its way through the house to the back door and then outside and fresh air.

Throughout the exercise a high-pitched squealing noise was often heard. While the sound was annoying, its purpose was for fireman safety. A device on each air pack would sound if the wearer did not make enough movement to keep it from going off, Bird said. Once beeping

started, wiggling a bit was enough to silence it. If a firemen was injured, the air pack monitor would go from beeping to a steady whine, indicating help was needed.

The packs also indicate when the oxygen bottle is running low. Full bottles last for 30 minutes, but in actual fires, stress, exertion and individual firemen's breathing patterns can shorten it to 15 minutes or so, said Bird, who recently marked 20 years on the department and has served as chief since September 2014.

Firefighters have another safety measure as part of their gear. Each fireman has a radio with which to communicate with each other. Each radio has a red button which, if pushed, opens all lines, including one to Hoopeston dispatch to let all know that a firefighter needs help.

During Saturday's exercise, as firemen were training on

what to look for in a building, Jared Rayls, who was manning the truck controls, kept his eyes on the condition of the fire from the outside. When the gray smoke turned to an angry black and flaming increased, Rayls, using the truck's siren and hom, alerted firemen that conditions had worsened and they needed to exit the structure.

Rayls is responsible for creating a new piece of equipment used at Saturday's fire. The water wall is a piece of pipe with holes in it that connects to a fire house. In use, it looks like an oscillated sprinkler that isn't oscillating and it's purpose is to move heat and smoke upwards to help keep nearby structures safe.

Rayls, who works in Indiana, and has seen a water wall in action, made one for Hoopeston's squad. Asked after the exercise what he thought, he thought it worked well enough but "I should have made the holes smaller to increase the pressure," he said.

According to tax records, the house was purchased in 2021 by Ross Swartz, of Wellington, who gave it to his wife, Diane. The house had been her childhood home but had deteriorated in recent years. The Swartzes approved the use of the structure for training purposes.

Earlier this year, the Swartzes purchased the lot north of 812 N. Market, which also had a dilapidated house on it. They since razed that building.

Once the Market St. house was razed, firemen moved to the 200 block of East Wyman for more training on another building.
