EPA phosphorus level change could cost Hoopeston millions

An Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) policy to decrease the amount of phosphorus in water supplies may costing Hoopeston millions of dollars.

Hoopeston hired Champaign-based engineering firm Fehr-Graham to conduct a study to determine Hoopeston's phosphorus rate. That was followed by a plan to lower the level by basically building a new plant with a \$24 million price tag, Wise said.

If Hoopeston would move forward with the recommendation, a \$5 million grant would be given and the remaining \$19 million financed at .67 percent for 30 years.

"That's the best-case scenario," Wise said. "It gets worse from here." Since the EPA has not set a final percentage of allowed phosphorus, if the agency lowers the amount, of allowable phosphorus, costs will go up. If they set the level at .5 mg/liter, "add another \$5 million, Wise said. "If they drop it down to .1 mg. add another \$5 on top of that."

On the plus side, Wise said Hoopeston's current water treatment plant is outdated and needs modernization. "The one thing about this is we'd basically have a new water treatment plant," he said.

The Fehr-Graham proposal calls for a new system but Wise has talked to another engineering firm that will retrofit parts of Hoopeston's existing system with new requirements. He did not release the name of the second

"Obviously the goal is to get the price down as much as possible," he said, adding, "even if we get better numbers, we're still talking millions."

Wise stressed that the phosphorus level does not make the water bad. Residents can rest assured that Hoopeston's water is safe to drink. "Our water, in my opinion, is some of the best you'll ever find," he said. "This is the EPA trying to solve a problem in the Mississippi River Basin."

Wise said he did not want to "bring (the issue) to the public's attention too soon because we don't need everybody freaking out," but wanted to let people know it
