Vermilion County moves to high level of C-19 transmission

Just days after Gov. J.B. Pritzker announced some Covid-19-related executive orders would expire later this month, the Illinois Department of Public Health announced Vermilion County has gone from a moderate transmission level to a high transmission level of Covid-19.

Vermilion County Health Administrator Doug Toole announced the change Friday afternoon, saying the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) advanced the county to the higher rating.

Guidelines for the higher transmission rate include wearing a well-fitting mask in public regardless of vaccination status, including k-12 schools and other indoor community settings.

Those who are immunocompromised or high risk for disease are encouraged to wear a mask or respirator that provides greater protection and consider avoiding non-essential indoor activities in public where they might be exposed.

Additionally, those who are immunocompromised or high risk for severe disease are urged to talk to their healthcare providers about wearing a masks and taking other precautions, such as testing.

Those who have household or social contact with someone with high risk for serious disease could consider self-testing to detect infection before contact; wearing a mask when indoors with them; staying upto-date on vaccines and boosters; maintaining improved ventilation in indoor spaces, where possible; and follow CDC recommendations for isolation and quarantine.

According to Illinois Department of Public Health data, the seven-day rolling average case rate per 100,000 people was 65.7. Twenty percent of intensive care beds were available in the region and two Coviddiagnosed hospital admissions were made.

The weekly deaths reported were at 0, with total Covid-related deaths at 297. The number of deaths has been holding at that number since Toole's May

27 report.

Iroquois County was at low community level, with individuals encouraged to stay up-to-date on vaccines and boosters and maintain improved ventilation in indoor spaces, when possible.
