Hoopeston council approves moving on HEMA building, contracts with attorney to find funds

The on again/off again plans for a new building for Hoopeston Emergency Management Agency (HEMA) is back on.

A building where HEMA could store its equipment and conduct training was approved in August 2020, when \$35,000 was listed in the 2021 budget. Aldermen were told that volunteers would provide much of the labor for the project.

Materials were purchased and a frame erected, but work stopped after two volunteers left the area and other volunteers had scheduling conflicts. Miscommunication between whether plumbing or framework should be first, then finding an affordable plumber added to the delay.

Then came Covid-19 supply shortages, which increased the cost of building materials. Meanwhile, left to the elements, some posts shifted and trusses bowed. The skeleton was removed and stored prior to the 2021 National Sweetcorn Festival, with the expectation that the posts would be reset and new trusses

With the original plan scrapped, officials sought bids to complete the project and bids were sought. In October 2021, the council approved a \$33,906.44 bid from a local company, but soon learned the bid was submitted without the owner's knowledge.

The council rescinded acceptance of that bid and approved the second bid submitted, for \$59,450.75 from Silver Brothers of Hoopeston.

Later, officials learned the original \$35,000 had not been earmarked to carry over into the next budget year and was absorbed into the general fund. It was decided that funds were not available and Brian Silver, of Silver Brothers, agreed to not hold the city to the bid acceptance.

When aldermen budgeted in April for this fiscal year, they discussed using Covid-related ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funds for the structure, but finance chairman Bob Porth suggested waiting for a while until those funds were more certain.

At Tuesday's meeting, Porth raised the question of whether to move forward with construction or shelve the project.

Ald. Kyle Richards recommended going forward with construction before costs rise more, while Mayor Jeff Wise asked whether officials would have to vote if a new bid was sought.

Porth replied that a new vote would be needed. As far as ARPA funds, he added that they were not yet in hand. "I'm not a trusting person," he said.

Brad Hardcastle, HEMA director, said the city's last installment of ARPA money came in just before last

year's National Sweetcorn Festival and estimated it would again this year.

Silver told the council that the building would be a garage-style construction, which if started quickly, could be up before the festival. A second option, pole barn construction, could also be done.

"If I don't get the OK tonight, it won't be done by festival, if that matters to you," Silver said.

Porth said the rough structure could be done in a first phase, with finishing work done in a second and, if needed, third phase.

Hardcastle said a finished building will now be about \$70,000, with some work being donated.

On a motion by Ald. Joe Garrett, Seconded by Richards, the council approved the action, 8-0.

In other business, the council:

• Approved a contract with Cox Law Firm of Monticello, to look for money to fund water/sewer improvements. Attorney David Cox has worked with ERH En-

terprises in the same way, Wise said, adding he believes Cox will find more money for necessary improvements. "And when I say 'more,' I mean millions more," he said.

As part of the agreement, Hoopeston will pay a \$5,800 outstanding bill which has been unpaid for about 18 months, Wise added.

- Approved 50/50 sidewalk bids from Silver Bros., of \$8.44 for sidewalks and \$8.51 for ramps. Silver's was the only bid received by the city.
- Wise also updated the council on the first meeting of the Citizens' Advisory Committee, held the evening before.

He told the council that eight of the 19 members attended the meeting and that two of the 19 who agreed to be on the committee resigned before the first meeting.

• Wise also said a second interview was scheduled for one candidate for police chief and that a permanent chief should be named soon.
