No decision made on police chief, property bid accepted

An offer made to a chief candidate was rejected, leaving officials still searching for a permanent chief for Hoopeston Police Department.
 The naming of a chief was listed on the agenda for Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, but, "You can go ahead and scratch that," Mayor Jeff Wise said at the start of the meeting.
 Three HPD officers attended the meeting and left when Wise said no announcement would be made.
 Asked what the holdup has been in naming a chief, Wise said, "We chose not to pursue a chief until contract negotiations were completed. We want to make the best decision for Hoopeston, so we aren't rushing it."

A three-year contract between Hoopeston and patrolmen represented by the Fraternal Order of Police was approved earlier this month.
 On March 3, Jim DeWitt, former chief, retired and Darin Tate, HPD investigator and the department's longest-serving officer, was named interim chief. Officials began a search, advertising in area media for candidates with 10 or more years experience, with a starting salary range of \$65,000 to \$75,000.
 Of the applications received, four candidates were interviewed by the council's police committee and the city's police commission in July, including a retired Danville officer who received and rejected the offer; Darin Tate, HPD Sgt. Quentin Morgan, and another area law enforcement officer.

In unrelated business, in a 6-0 vote, aldermen approved a \$1,003.50 bid from Steve Bane for the lots at 105 and 107 E. Main. Council members Joe Garrett and Robin Lawson were absent at Tuesday's meeting.
 Bane, father of Jennifer Lind, who, with her husband, Bill, own Pizza King, bought the lots for them, Wise said after the meeting.
 This was the second bidding for the properties. The council first voted on bids submitted by the Linds and Bob and Emily Brown at the May 3 meeting. A motion to award the bid to Linds received two yes votes, three no votes and three abstentions.
 A motion to accept the Browns' vote received four yes votes, two no votes and two abstentions. Wise announced he was vetoing the acceptance. The Browns then withdrew their bid, and new bids were solicited.
 In other business:
 ●Ald. Carl Ankenbrand, police committee chairman, said officer candidates Brodee Herman and Brant Ramos passed the POWER test, prequalifying for that at the Police Training Institute.
 Those classes will begin September 12 and end in mid-December, said Interim Chief Darin Tate.
