Bennett encourages residents to sign petition to change Safe-T Act

Early last year Illinois enacted a bill known as the SAFE-T Act which was advertised as criminal justice reform. In reality, it has made it harder for police officers to do their jobs and made it easier for criminals to be released back out onto the streets.

On January 1 Illinois will end cash bail for most offenses. This means that the number of crimes for which a person can be held in jail between arrest and trial will be greatly reduced. Persons arrested for

some serious crimes could be released almost as soon as they are arrested.

The bill was opposed by almost every law enforcement group in the state, and I agreed with them. I voted No because I believe this will make Illinois less safe. Lawsuits have been filed by state's attorneys throughout the state - including Jacqueline Lacy in Vermilion County - trying to halt the law, and we are still working to bring about change through the legislative process.

But we need your help. The only way to generate enough pressure to force changes is to show that there is public demand for stopping this law before it takes effect on January 1.
