Council unanimously declines to fund NAPA frontage road

The new NAPA store on Rt. 1 will not have a frontage road paid for with taxpayer dollars.

In a 6-0 vote, Hoopeston City Council voted down a motion by Ald. Kyle Richards to pay for the road. Richards then voted "no" on his motion, along with the rest of the council. Ald. Jesse Gonzalez was absent and a Ward II seat is vacant after Carl Ankenbrand resigned after moving out of the city.

In discussion before the vote, Mayor Jeff Wise said a frontage road was not part of original discussions between the city and store owner Roger Dittrich. Recently, when Dittrich raised the question of a frontage road, he requested the city pay half, but at the October 18 meeting, asked for the entire cost - estimated at about \$38,000 - to be paid by the city.

Ald. Stephen Eyrich said the proposal was not a frontage road to accommodate other development on the property, but rather a road just to the NAPA store.

In other business, Ald. Robin Lawson reported on the December 1 police committee meeting, in which the committee decided to add a third sergeant position on the department, putting a sergeant on each shift.

There is currently one sergeant on second shift and one on third. For many years, the police chief has been in charge of day shift.

The committee also recommended boosting sergeant pay from \$2,400 per year to \$4,000 per year; having an investigator on day shift and second shift; and purchasing a new squad car.

Lawson also reported on the November 21 façade committee meeting, held after the council voted to have the façade committee review its policies.

The façade committee approved minor changes, including that an applicant must own a "commercial" building within Hoopeston city limits; asking whether the owner has received a façade grant in the past five years and requiring a requestor's signature on a statement acknowledging that the owner will comply with the guidelines, understands the façade program is a voluntary one and that the city has the right to approve or deny any project, proposal or portion of either.

Lawson added that the committee reviewed facade policies from several other communities and that Hoopeston's requirements were in line with other communities.

In unrelated business, the council:

- Ward II Alderman, four-year term currently held by Carl Ankenbrand
- •Ward III Alderman, two-year term currently held by Jesse Gonzalez; four-year term currently held by Joe Garrett
- Ward IV Alderman, four-year term, currently held by Robin Lawson

Hoopeston's umbrella policy for liability and workman's compensation insurance increased by \$30,000, to \$219,278.12, in part due to adding several new vehicles.

- Unanimously approved the 2023-24 tax levy of \$900,950. In his portion of the meeting, attorney Steve Miller suggested he should review the levy document.
- Unanimously approved allowing Paul Kelnhofer to purchase the alley between the 100 block of East Lincoln and Maple, for a cost to be determined by statute. Kelnhofer owns the property on both sides of the alley, Wise said.
- Approved Michael Ferrell as a new member of the Citizens Advisory Committee, replacing a member who resigned. Ferrell is the husband of Ald. Kellie Ferrell. who voted "present" on the matter.
- Unanimously approved cleaning up debris from the house that burned at 1009 W. Main. The owner quitclaimed the property to the city. Silver Brothers submitted an offer to remove the debris for \$5,400, if the city

- will pay landfill fees, he said. • Heard from Wise that a new business, MK Vape & Tobacco, opened at Rtes. 1 and 9. Saying he stopped in, "it's a really nice-looking, clean store," he said.
- Wise also told the council that an insurance adjuster has approved settling on the Bzzz Bar fire, which occurred in March 2019.
