

It took four OTs but the Westville Tigers bested The Cornjerkers, 67-64, to nab fifth place in the Watseka Holiday basketball tournament on December 20.

Anthony Zamora led the Cornjerkers with 34 points, followed by Kendrick Sigerill with 14. Trenton Montez and Preston VanDeVeer each had seven and Owen Root ended the game with two. Zamora led the team in rebounds, with 10, followed by Sigerill with seven.

The Cornjerkers put one in the W column when they hosted Cerro-Gordo/Bement Tuesday. The tem held the Broncos to only nine points in the first half and came away on top, 65-53.

Zamora led Cornjerker scoring with 17 and went seven for eight at the free-throw line. Root scored nine of his 12 points in the first half. Sigerell finished with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Wyatt Eisenman made five of six at the free-throw line and finished with seven, along with Mason Rush, who was seven for 10 at the line.
