SAF-T-Act provisions on hold statewide, more than 180 new Illinois laws go into effect

More than 180 laws and regulations became effective January 2023 and two former taxes will again be paid by residents, but parts of the law that received the most press last year are on hold.

The cashless bail portion of the SAFE-T (Safety Accountability, Fairness, and Equity-Today) Act was put on hold by the Illinois Supreme Court Saturday afternoon just hours before it was to take effect Sunday.

The action came after 21st Judicial Circuit Chief Judge Thomas W. Cunnington on Wednesday ruled that the bail reform and pretrial release provisions violated the Illinois Constitution. Cunnington ruled that the 65 of Illinois' 102 counties which filed suit against the act would not have to enforce those provisions.

On Saturday, states attorneys from DuPage and Kane counties filed an emergency motion to suspend the law until the high court can decide the matter. The state's high court ruled that removing the cash bail component would take power from state judges and allowed the motion, writing, "In order to maintain consistent pretrial proce-

Illinois gas, grocery taxes back

Gas prices have been going down but Illinois drivers can expect to see two increases in the state's gas tax this year.

Gov. J.B. Pritzker, as part of the state's 2023 fiscal year budget, put on hold for six months the mandatory gas tax that is tied to inflation. The increase, which should have become effective last July, was waived for six months.

Slated to cost drivers 2.2 center per gallon, the new amount was calculated using the Department of Labor Consumer Price Index for All urban Consumers increased over a 12-month period, which ended September 1, 2022. That number was 8.2 percent, bring the tax to about 3.2 cents per gallon, resulting in a total state fuel tax of 42.4 cents per gallon for unleaded gas.

On July 1, the annual tax increase for the 2024 fiscal year, will go into effect. Part of the Rebuild Illinois infra-

dures throughout Illinois, the effective date of the Pretrial Fairness Act is stayed during the pendency of the appeal ... and until further order of this Court."

As the sides wrangle with the SAF-T-Act, other laws took effect with little fanfare, including:

HB 00209: Bans latex gloves for the use of handling and preparing food.

HB 00568: Allows the Comptroller's Office to establish an interactive map on the Comptroller's website that provides the location and annual financial information of taxing bodies.

HB 00601: Expands the definition of the crime of possessing burglary tools to include devices to unlock or start a vehicle without a key and duplicating a signal from a key fob of a vehicle.

HB 02775: Aims to make it easier for low-income families to find housing by declaring that it is a civil rights violation for any person engaging in real estate transactions to discriminate based on source of income.

HB 03118: Prohibits commercial applicators from applying a barrier mosquitocide between Oct. 16 and April 14 unless it's for public health purposes or the Department of Agriculture determines there is a significant unmet need.

HB 03296: Requires school boards to establish a career and technical education pathway program for grades 6 through 12.

HB 03465: Requires the Department of Corrections to hire reentry specialists for every jail and correctional institution or facility, regardless of whether these institutions or facilities have access to a reentry program.

HB 03772: Provides people whose cars were stolen are not be liable for violations, fees, fines or penalties when caught on red light cameras or speed cameras.

HB 04386: Allows single fire rifles to be used for deer hunting in Illinois. Brings Illinois into parity with other Midwest states.

HB 04729: Tasks the Illinois Department of Public Health with developing and implementing a statewide

firearm storage and safety campaign that will include public messaging, distribution of gun locks and safes and buyback programs in partnership with law enforcement.

HB 04766: Designates Aug. I as Sweet Corn Appreciation Day.

HB 04798: Allows currently enrolled educator students in Illinois with 90 credit hours to qualify for a substitute teaching license.

HB 05026: Removes "Susan G. Komen Foundation" from mammogram license plates and the money collected will be paid to the Illinois Department of Public Health for the Breast and Cervical Cancer Program to provide patient

structure legislation, the law increased the tax from 19 cents - where it had been for two decades - to 38 cents per gallon, with annual increases tied to the CPI annual increase.

Also in July, residents can wave goodbye to the oneyear moratorium on the one percent grocery tax Pritzker suspended the tax on "food for human consumption that is to be consumed off the premises where it is sold," and did not apply to alcoholic beverages, soft drinks, candy and food prepared for immediate consumption.

Money from the grocery tax returns to the municipality where it was generated. Last June, Ald. Bob Porth, city finance committee chairman, said the tax moratorium would cost Hoopeston about \$93,000.

Before the waiver was approved by the General Assembly, Pritzker said he would look for other funding sources for municipalities losing the sales tax. Porth said a letter from Pritzker detailing the plan did not include a way of paying municipalities for the lost income.

Illinois is one of 13 states that imposes a grocery tax. At one percent, it is at the lower end of the scale with only Arkansas lower, at .125 percent. Mississippi is highest at seven percent.
