Council member praises fire, police department for efforts

Hoopeston first responders got a pat on the back during Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Ald. Robin Lawson praised Hoopeston Fire Department for its work in 2022, which included significantly more fires than previous years, especially the number of structure fires.

She specifically mentioned the department fighting two simultaneous house fires - one in the 800 block of South Fifth St. and one in the 600 block of East Young - on December 22, when a winter storm brought below zero temperatures and winds gusting to 50 m.p.h., resulting in extremely low wind chill factors.

In addition, Lawson praised police officers, who not only face new state-mandated changes in law enforcement, but who have been working shorthanded, and dispatchers, for all their efforts for the city.

New officers were recently hired, which will provide much-needed manpower, she added.

In a related matter, Mayor Jeff Wise, reporting for street/alley committee chairman Ald. Jesse Gonzalez, said although Hoopeston did not receive much snow in the pre-Christmas storm, freezing rain necessitated salting some city intersections.

Snow routes were activated on December 22 in preparation for the storm. Forecasters were sure about bitterly cold temperatures and high winds but less sure about snowfall.

Also reporting for Gonzalez, Wise asked for approval of an MFT Expenditure Request-Adjusting expenditure. The adjustment is "\$179,999 and change," Wise said, and covers construction and engineering. Asked what the project is, Wise apologized for not having that information at the meeting. The council approved the request, 7-0.

In unrelated business, the council:

• Heard from newly-appointed Ward 2 Ald. Rachelle Miller, fire committee chairman, who asked for approval of a resolution for an intergovernmental agreement for participation in a mutual aid alarm system. Her request was approved, 7-0.



City committees shuffled, commission gets new members

The addition of new aldermen has resulted in a shuffling of committees of the Hoopeston City Council.

Rachelle Miller, appointed last month to replace Carl Ankenbrand, who moved from the city, was named chairman of the ambulance/fire committee. Committee members are Bob Porth and former committee chair Robin Lawson.

Lawson now chairs the police committee. Ald. Joe Garrett, who chaired the committee before Carl Ankenbrand was appointed to the board in February, is now a committee member, along with Jesse Gonzalez.
