Illinois sheriffs say they will not enforce state's new gun ban

Slightly more than one-third of Illinois sheriffs have told their constituents they will not enforce the Protect Illinois Communities Act, signed into law Tuesday by Gov. J.B. Pritzker.

The law bans the purchase, sale and manufacture of semi-automatic so-called "assault weapons" and large-capacity magazines. Iroquois County Sheriff Clinton Perzee

is among sheriffs who said they will not enforce the mandate. He, and other like-minded sheriffs,

shared a letter with their residents, stating

that, as sheriff, part of his job is "to protect the rights provided to all of us in the Constitution. One of those enumerated rights is the right of the people to keep and bear arms under the 2nd amendment.

"I, among many others, believe that (the Protect Illinois Communities Act) is a clear violation of the 2nd Amendment to the Constitution."

In his letter, Perzee said he is fully supported by the Iroquois County Board, who passed a resolution in opposition to the act on December 13, 2022.

"Therefore, as the custodian of the jail and chief law enforcement official for Iro-

quois County, neither myself nor my office will be checking to ensure that lawful gun owners register their weapons with the State, nor will we be arresting or housing law abiding individuals that have been arrested solely with non-compliance of this Act,' he wrote.

be investigated and enforced by this Office based on the facts and circumstances of each case, he added.

Letters from sheriffs in other counties echoed the same points as Perzee's. It is believed the Illinois Sheriffs Association (ISA) provided a template for sheriffs to use.

ISA announced Wednesday that it is "extremely disappointed" that the Act was passed, "that further regulates and limits the purchase of a variety of weapons for lawful gun owners.

"The ISA has opposed this legislation throughout its development and remains opposed to the bill as passed by the General Assembly and signed by the Governor. We, as representatives of chief law enforcement officials throughout Illinois, aver very concerned and disturbed by the ongoing and escalating violence throughout our State and Country.

"We are always supportive of new tools, techniques and laws that assist us in preventing and holding accountable those that wage efforts of harm and violence on others.

"However, this new law does not do that. We will continue to advocate on behalf of Sheriffs and the lawabiding citizens throughout Illinois."

Pritzker said there will be consequences for police, counties or others who refuse to enforce the law. "They will in fact do their job or they won't be in their job," he was quoted as saying Tuesday during a press conference.

The Protect Illinois Communities Act is expected to be challenged in court.
