DACC HLC works to remove obstacles to equivalency diploma

Sometimes bad choices can have a long-lasting negative effect on someone's life. The decision to drop out of high school is one that often leads to lower paying jobs, lack of advancement and years of struggling to make ends meet. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, those who quit school but go on to earn their GED out-earn those who don't by more than \$10,000 annually.

The DACC Higher Learning Center (HLC) in Hoopeston is removing as many barriers as possible for area residents to take the General Education Development (GED) test. "We have more options now than ever to offer classes and instruction in a way that meets the individual needs of students," said HLC Director Karla Coon. Those options include:

• GED high school equivalency prep classes are offered by DACC at the Hoopeston center at no charge to the students.

• Flexibility of instruction, with students able to choose in-person or online classes and class times, with morning and evening sessions in Hoopeston. Monday and Wednesday classes are set from 6-8:30 p.m., with morning classes from 9 a.m. - noon Mondays through Thursdays.


• Individual tutoring is available, if needed.

• The HLC computer lab is available to students at flexible times.

By using the code ILSAVE20, students can earn their GED for just \$40 for all four tests, which normally cost \$120. • Students may choose either the GED or HiSet test format. HiSet is offered mainly because it offers a paper test for students who lack confidence in their computer skills.

Additionally, Coon said, DACC can help students create a vision for their educational and career goals. The 2023 job market in central Illinois is full of opportunities, she said, adding students can pursue training to earn program certificates in many fields and get a good paying job close to home.



Having taught at Hoopeston Area High School since 2012, Glenn Brewer has seen students drop out and the struggles that they go through. He is teaching GED classes at the Higher Learning Center, and Coon is thankful to have him.

"Many people who inquire about enrolling in GED express fear of the math portion of the class and the exam," she said. People are encouraged to study and test first in the areas in which they are more confident, "but that math keeps some from even starting. This is one reason why I am thankful to have Glenn teaching for us, since math is his area of expertise."

Brewer said the GED process is not quick and it requires lots of time. Since the test covers material learned in grades K-12, students should expect to dedicate time outside of class, Coon said.
