Tractor Supply looking at Pamida building for new store

Hoopeston officials are hopeful a Tractor Supply store will locate at the former Pamida store in Hoopeston Plaza.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Mayor Jeff Wise handed out a sample letter to Hoopeston Plaza owners, responding to questions about Hoopeston ordinances related to businesses, such as whether outdoor merchandise displays are allowed.

"I'm pretty much on board with whatever they want," Wise said, adding that the addition will benefit the city.

Odds are in Hoopeston's favor for the new business. "I would tend towards it's a done deal...but it's not guaranteed," Wise said. However, the level of surety is "beyond 'interest," he added.

Wise did not mention the business' name until he concluded his remarks on the matter. "I didn't say 'Tractor Supply,' but I'll say 'Tractor Supply,'" he said, wrapping up discussion.

In other business, Ald. Bob Porth again issued cautions about the budget for next fiscal year and the need to get an early start on working on the document.

Porth said he provided aldermen with budget information for this year, including estimated expense totals for each department.

In preparing the new 2023-24 budget, Porth said that while departments can include one-time expenses - usually big-ticket items that are not recurring - few may be allowed, as the priority will be operating costs, payroll and other necessary expenses.

He encouraged committee chairs to meet with their department heads and review expenses. In looking at current department budgets, Porth said, "I don't even know what some of these are." While he wants departments to have what they need, some wants may have to go, like subscriptions to magazines or memberships in associations.

Officials have discussed the need to up the city's pay scale to get and keep good employees. To that end, he asked that committee chairs and department heads meet to put on paper what a starting salary should be for a new hire and also the steps at which raises would be given, based on the position and skills needed for the job.

As an example, Porth said the number of city water customers dropped to 2,220. The number is used to calculate not only income for the water department, which must be financially self-sustaining, but also things like the fee to continue to have local police dispatching, he said. As the number of customers goes down, so does the amount available to help keep the service.

Porth said he'd like to be able to start the budget process sometime in mid-March.

In other action, the council approved, 5-0, resolutions with Fehr-Graham engineering and Cox law firm. Fehr-Graham is doing engineering and other work on wastewater treatment plant upgrades, while Cox is looking for grants for the work.

Attorney Steve Miller questioned what agreements would be forthcoming and how they would obligate the city.

Ald. Stephen Eyrich, water/sewer chair, said as the project goes along, costs will be brought forward, calling language in the agreements "boilerplate."

Wise added that Cox needed information for grant research that Fehr-Graham had but would not disclose without something in writing from the city.

Ald. Kellie Ferrell seconded Eyrich's motion for approval. Both voted aye, along with Porth, Rachelle Miller and Kyle Richards. Ald. Joe Garrett arrived after the vote was taken and Jesse Gonzales and Robin Lawson were absent.

Eyrich also reported a water leak at Penn and Euclid, where leaks have previously occurred. "This time, I want it fixed completely and right so we don't have to do it again," he said.

In unrelated business Wise said it will be "all hands on deck" when city employees remove bleachers from Hoopeston Area High School and relocate them to McFerren Park. Street and alley and parks departments and others were scheduled to do the work Wednesday, but Wise said rain would probably delay the project.
