That was true again last week, as residents from northern Vermilion County turned out for a blood drive in honor of Dave Anderson, local farmer and Butler Township Supervisor. A community blood drive was held February 28 at First Church of God, Hoopeston. It was sponsored by Hoopeston FFA Alumni. A second drive was held March 1 at Hoopeston Area High School, sponsored by the student council. Normally held for faculty and students, the school opened its drive to the public in support of Mr. Anderson. Both were resounding successes, said Elizabeth Silver, who coordinated public awareness for the events. The community drive set a goal of 35 pints and collected 50. Two people were unable to

give and there were seven cancellations, Silver said. "But seven people stepped up

> and did walk-ins," Silver said. Of the 52 people total, 24 were first-time donors.

The high school's goal was 38. Forty-two pints were collected. Of the 42 donors, 12 were first-timers, said teacher Ashley Gondzur, student council sponsor. Six people who signed up were unable to keep their appointments.

The school gets money for a scholarship based on the number of pints collected in its two blood drives this year. "We are able to give a \$586 scholarship this year," she said.

Those 88 combined pints will help significantly more people. "One pint of blood can actually save up to three lives, according to ImpactLife," Silver said, "so they always tell us we saved three times as many donations as

we received."

quickly into acute myeloid leukemia (AML), said his son, Ryan Anderson.

"My dad is hoping that after this targeted treatment he took, that he will regrow new cells and regress the cancer back to the MDS side, which would allow him to hopefully return to some source of normal life," Anderson said.

The treatments completely erased Dave Anderson's immune system. "The hope is he will grow new, healthy cells, which is where we are now, he added."

As Anderson has learned, his dad is not the only one who might benefit from a blood drive. One person is Aleyah Carley, from Gifford, he said. That's when Russ Leigh and Silver organized the event on behalf of the Future Farmers of America, "which my dad strongly believes in to encourage young farmers to pursue this important career."

The Andersons are very much involved with each other, not only as a family but in their businesses, as well. Dave Anderson helps out at Anderson Funeral Home, owned by Ryan. The elder Anderson is also involved with the younger's tractor-pulling ventures. warn others about scam phone calls they recently received.
