Hinkle retires, Chamber to merge with Vermilion Advantage

After 12 years at the helm, Valarie Hinkle has retired from her role as Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce president.

Hinkle was honored on her retirement at a farewell party April 5 at the Hoopeston Multi Agency, where fellow Chamber officers, city dignitaries and others whose paths intersected with hers came to wish her well. Her last day will be April 30.

Hinkle assumed the mantle of Chamber president in 2011 because, "I wanted to make a difference in our community," she said.

The thing she is most proud of in her tenure is the revitalization of Hoopeston's downtown. "My husband (Mark Hinkle) knew of my passion to revive downtown Hoopeston," she said, "which is why we purchased the old Manion law office, remodeled and ... started our business, Simple Treasures, even though we both had full

time jobs."

Simply Treasures, which offered new and used home décor, opened in 2015 at 216 S. Market, while Hinkle was also serving as community liaison for Gibson Hospital & Health Care.

Asked if anything on her to-do list is undone, Hinkle said, "Really nothing I wanted to get done, but getting a dentist office in town has always been something I wanted to see happen and hopefully, Gibson Hospital will accomplish that in the near future."

Her best memory of her time with the Chamber is something that has become the group's signature, annual event: The Magical Express Christmas event.

Started in 2013, The Magical Express was, at first, the shuttle that took children to the McFerren Park Civic Center for "The Magic of Christmas," where youngsters could meet Santa and take part in holiday activities, such as cookie-decorating and festive face painting.

The event became The Magical Express in 2014 and has continued such since then.

The best part of the Magic Express, Hinkle said, is "watching the excitement on the kids' faces when they see Santa."

Although Hinkle is retiring, she and others will reunite for this year's Magical Express. Abby Eberly, Chamber treasurer and Maple School Project Success employee, will coordinate the event and Hinkle and

other Chamber members will step up to guide Eberly and her crew.

One of the things Hinkle has done as president is bring attention to new businesses - as well as existing businesses relocating to a different location or getting new owners - by way of ribbon-cuttings. Hinkle said she doesn't know how many ribbon-cuttings she's been involved with but said for many years, there were none. "But things have changed and we have been doing several the past three years," she said. "We're always so excited to welcome new business owners to our community and look forward to even more ribbon cuttings and greater things to come."

Hinkle doesn't have a least-favorite memory from her Chamber years, but does have "a disappointment that due to our busy lives, it's hard for people to find time to get involved in our community organizations."

It is because of the lack of volunteers that Hoopeston's Chamber will merge with Vermilion Advantage, when Hinkle and other Chamber members retire this year.

Because no one stepped up to volunteer, the board reached out to Vermilion Advantage's Nicole Van Hyfte, who serves as director of the Danville Chamber of Commerce.

Hinkle said she and Vermilion Advantage representatives met with Mayor Jeff Wise to discuss the vacant Chamber positions and the benefits Vermilion Advantage would bring to Hoopeston businesses. "He agreed it would be a beneficial move," she said.

The Chamber board - Hinkle, vice-president Beth Knecht of Hoopeston Multi Agency, Eberly, secretary Diane Theesfeld, Vanessa From of Autumn Fields and Katina Opgenorth from Adecco, - approved the change, which Hinkle said "was based on the best interest of our community businesses."

Chamber account funds will remain in a local bank, allocated for The Magical Express and local events in the Hoopeston area, Hinkle added.

The Chamber's Welcome banners will continue to be available to businesses during the National Sweetcorn Festival and will be included as part of the business memberships, she said.

Hinkle is leaving the Chamber with a thankful heart. She is thankful for Knecht, Van Hyfte and Joy Gocking for their work on her retirement party and thankful for all those who came out to celebrate her retirement.

The occasion featured a Taste of Hoopeston, as Knecht organized food from Hoopeston restaurants to feed guests at the event, while Gocking designed center pieces and other niceties for the celebration.

Hinkle is thankful for the love, support, flowers and gifts she received. "I am truly thankful and blessed," she said. "It has been an honor to serve the Hoopeston community."
