# District judge issues preliminary injunction against gun ban

A U.S. district judge on Friday issued a preliminary injunction against Illinois' "assault weapons" ban.

U.S. District Judge Stephen M. McGlynn issued the opinion, noting Illinois has plenty of gun laws already on the books that need to be enforced.

The case, Barnett v. Raoul, is a consolidation of many suits filed against the Protect Illinois Communities Act (PICA). Plaintiffs in the consolidated cases requested a preliminary injunction under the Federal Rule of Civil Procedures to prevent PICA enforcement until a final determination is made on the law's constitutionality.

Defendants in the case include Gov. Jay Robert Pritzker, Attorney General Kwame Raoul, and Brendan Kelly, Illinois State Police Director.

In his opinion, McGlvnn noted that PICA was crafted after an Independence Day celebration in Highland Park. During a parade, "a senseless tragedy occurred involving firearms and multiple paradegoers were killed and wounded," McGlynn wrote.

Proponents of PICA cited the Highland Park incident as an impetus for passing the law, which placed sweeping restrictions and outright bans on the sale, purchase, manufacture, delivery, importation, and possession of many firearms, magazines, attachments, stocks and grips," he wrote, adding the law was immediately challenged as unconstitutional.

McGlynn cited two cases heard by the U.S. Supreme Court, Bruen and Heller, in his opinion, writing, "As Americans, we have every reason to celebrate our rights and freedoms, especially on Independence Day. Can the senseless crimes of a relative few be so despicable to justify the infringement of the constitutional rights of law-abiding individuals in hopes that such crimes will then abate or, at least, not be as horrific? More specifically, can PICA be harmonized with the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution and with Bruen? That is the issue before this Court. The simple answer at this stage in the proceedings is "likely no.

"The Supreme Court in Bruen and Heller held that citizens have a constitutional right to own and possess firearms and may use them for self-defense. PICA seems to be written in spite of the clear directives in Bruen and Heller, not in conformity with them. Whether well intentioned, brilliant, or arrogant, no state may enact a law that denies its citizens rights that the Constitution guarantees them. Even legislation that may enjoy the support of a majority of its citizens must fail if it violates the constitutional rights of fellow citizens. For the reasons fully set out below, the overly broad reach of PICA commands that the injunctive relief requested by Plaintiffs be granted."

McGlynn was appointed to the U.S. District Court of Southern Illinois in September 2020.

Pritzker signed PICA into law on January 10, stopping the sale of several common semi-automatic firearms by name or description of features and limiting magazines to 10 rounds for rifles and 15 for pistol mags.

Under PICA, owners of the targeted guns had until January 1, 2024 to register them with the Illinois State Police, providing the make, model and serial number of the specified weapons to obtain a special endorsement on their Firearm Owners Identification, (FOID) card.

Immediately after the law was passed, sheriffs in most of Illinois' 102 counties announced they would not enforce the law and sought to have the law overturned.

# City council approves civic center, infrastructure projects

The McFerren Park Civic Center is getting an update, thanks to action taken at the April 18 Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Alderman unanimously approved a \$6,000 quote from Carter's Floor Sanding and Refinishing of Rantoul, requested by Ald. Rachelle Miller.

Miller took over civic center improvements after Kyle Richards' resignation from the council was announced.

Miller said the work includes prepping the floor, sanding it, filling gouges and three coats of polyurethane. The work is expected to take two to three days and be completed by the end of July.

"By sanding and refinishing the stage floor at this moment, the stage will be brought to a safe and quality condition, ensuring it's prepared for the upcoming Sweetcorn Festival," she said.

In other business, the council unanimously approved a request from Ald. Stephen Eyrich to fund water and sewer lines for the West Maple St. extension. The project, estimated at \$300,000, is about half the \$600,000 budgeted for one-time expenses in the department's FY 2024 budget.

At least four parcels in the block - part of the Silver

Bros. addition to Hoopeston - are expected to be used for residential development. According to county records, the property is classified as vacant lots-land.

Mayor Jeff Wise called it "an all or nothing project. It's either going to be farmland or it's going to be a subdivision. We're not going to do it for one lot...and then wait 10 years" to do another lot.

After further discussion, he said the decision would be a difficult one to make. "We want Hoopeston to be known as a town that builds its infrastructure," but also need to consider city finances, he said.

Votes for the civic center floor and extending the utilities were 6-0, with Kyle Richards and Jesse Gonzalez absent.
