Council to charge food truck fee, limit shipping container use

The cost of operating a food truck in Hoopeston will increase after action taken by Hoopeston City Council at its May 15 meeting.

On a motion from Ald. Kellie Ferrell, seconded by Ald. Bob Porth, four others - Stephen Eyrich, Michael Ferrell, Angela Highfill and Robin Lawson - agreed to implement a \$20-per-day fee on the mobile food service businesses. Ald. Joe Garrett voted "present."

The agreement did not come quickly, as the council haggled over the amount of the fee, as well as whether food trucks in Hoopeston for the National Sweetcorn Festival would have to pay the fee.

Garrett suggested they should, but Eyrich and Mayor

Jeff Wise disagreed, both commenting on the number of people the Labor Day weekend festival bring to Hoopeston. "I don't know of any other even that brings 100,000 people to Hoopeston, he said.

Once that issue was settled, the council moved on to the amount. A \$250 annual fee had been previously discussed and was alluded to during the meeting. Eyrich commented that food trucks are in direct competition with brick-and-mortar stores and said the annual fee could be "to get into Hoopeston," plus the daily fee.


Highfill said the annual fee would be off-putting for vendors who might only come a couple of times. "If I

have to pay \$250 a year, I'm not going to come," she said.

Wise, too, encouraged the council not to charge too much, saying if the fee was too high, vendors wouldn't come. "I know you don't care," he said to Lawson, who owns Mr. B's, The Burger Bank and The Barn, "but I'm talking about for everyone else. Why come to Hoopeston for \$25 a day when you can go to Rantoul for \$100 a year?"

"I do care that people want variety," Lawson replied, adding she also cares about existing businesses losing

money. The suggested \$25 daily fee could be collected serving only two people, she added.

"It isn't our fault food trucks have become popular," Wise said. "This is what every community is dealing with," he continued, adding Rantoul is four times Hoopeston's size

Lawson then asked whether Hoopeston would lower the liquor licenses since Hoopeston has a smaller population than Rantoul.

The ordinance also contains provisions for ice cream trucks and details where trucks may park, operating hours and other criteria.

The shipping container ordinance limits the use of the containers in residential areas and was approved 6-1, with Garrett voting no.

While the ordinance covers "portable storage devices," Garrett asked why residents should not be allowed to have them. For example, he said, if someone could purchase a container to use as a garage more cheaply than having one built, why should the city forbid it. Asked how anyone would know if a storage container is filled with junk, "I cant' tell if a garage has junk in it or not," he

said. His argument failed to sway the others.

In a moment of humor during discussion, Ald. Michael Ferrell asked questions about foundations and walls for the containers, prompting his wife to wag her finger in his direction. "Don't even start on that," she said. "I swear."

Storage containers - called a "public nuisance" in the ordinance - have sprung up in many communities, including Hoopeston. "Some, I don't know how they put it there," Wise said. "Must have been a master behind the wheel."

The approved ordinance allows licensed and bonded contractors to use the containers to store materials and equipment for a maximum of 120 days or an additional period, if approved by the building inspector.

The penalty for violating the ordinance is a fine of not more than \$750 per day, with each day the law is violated as a separate offense.

After the meeting, Kellie Ferrell said city attorney Steven Miller is looking into whether existing containers can be grandfathered in, as they are not permanent structures.
