new owners and new management, several years later, in 2012, both theaters were closed and went into fore-closure.

When the Lorraine Foundation acquired the two properties in fall of 2013, cleanup began at both locations. The board also unanimously approved changing the name of Lorraine II to the Little Lorraine to differentiate between the two theaters.

On December 19th, 2013, the Little Lorraine, now with 48 seats, began showing movies again starting with Goonies and Fast and Furious 6.

In 2018, with the start of Friday Night Pizza & A movie, the group realized it was time to enhance the movie-going experience at LL with fresh paint in the lobby and the auditorium along with new stadium seating and permanent tables were added for pizza nights. Also the sound and projection was upgraded.
